A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	OFFICE OF GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
7	"Director" means the director of the office of gun violence
8	prevention.
9	"Office" means the office of gun violence prevention.
10	§ -2 Office of gun violence prevention; established.
11	(a) There shall be established within the department of law
12	enforcement, for administrative purposes only, an office of gun
13	violence prevention.
14	(b) The head of the office of gun violence prevention
15	shall be known as the director of the office of gun violence
16	prevention and shall be appointed by the governor pursuant to
17	section 26-34.

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1	(c)	The director shall be responsible for:
2	(1)	Serving as the principal officer in state government
3		responsible for the performance, development, and
4		control of programs, policies, and activities under
5		the jurisdiction of the office;
6	(2)	Administering funds allocated for the office and
7		applying for, receiving, and disbursing grants and
8		donations from all sources for gun violence
9		prevention;
10	(3)	Assessing the policies and practices of other state
11		and county agencies relating to gun violence
12		prevention; and
13	(4)	Advising state and county agencies on new legislation,
14		programs, and policy initiatives relating to gun
15		violence prevention.
16	(d)	The office of gun violence prevention shall:
17	(1)	Conduct public awareness campaigns in a culturally
18		appropriate manner to educate Hawaii residents about
19		state and federal laws and existing resources relating
20		to gun violence prevention, including but not limited
21		to:

1		(A)	Safe and responsible gun ownership;
2		(B)	Reporting of lost or stolen firearms, including
3			any state reporting requirements;
4		(C)	Best practices for safe storage of firearms;
5		(D)	Filing and obtaining orders of protection; and
6		(E)	Accessing available mental health and substance
7			use resources;
8	(2)	Admi	nister a grant program for organizations to
9		cond	uct community-based gun violence intervention
10		init	iatives focused on interrupting cycles of gun
11		viol	ence, trauma, and retaliation that are evidence-
1 2		info	rmed and have demonstrated promise at reducing gun
13		viol	ence without contributing to mass incarceration;
14	(3)	Crea	te and maintain a resource bank as a repository
15		for	data, research, and statistical information
16		rega	rding gun violence in Hawaii; and
17	(4)	Deve	lop a plan to address gun violence in Hawaii and
18		coor	dinate, improve, and expand upon existing plans
19		for	gun violence prevention.
20	(e)	The	office may collaborate with any other state or
21	county agency to fulfill the purposes of this chapter.		

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§ -3 Grant program. (a) There shall be established a
 gun violence prevention grant program to be developed and
 administered by the office of gun violence prevention. Subject
 to availability of funds, the office shall award grants to
 organizations to conduct community-based gun violence
 intervention initiatives.

7 (b) The office shall develop criteria for the awarding of 8 grants and shall establish standards, policies, and procedures 9 for the administration of the gun violence prevention grant 10 program.

(c) Applications for grants shall be made to the office and shall contain the information required by rules. At a minimum, the applicant shall:

14 (1) Agree to use state funds exclusively for the purposes15 of the gun violence prevention program;

16 (2) Indicate capability to properly use the grant for the17 purpose of the program;

18 (3) Comply with all applicable federal and state laws
19 prohibiting discrimination against any person on the
20 basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
21 creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, disability, or



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1		any other characteristic protected under applicable
2		federal or state law;
3	(4)	Agree not to use state funds for entertainment or
4		perquisites;
5	(5)	Comply with all applicable federal, state, and county
6		statutes, rules, and ordinances;
7	(6)	Agree to indemnify and save harmless the State and its
8		officers, agents, and employees from and against any
9		and all claims arising out of or resulting from
10		activities carried out or projects undertaken with
11		grant funds and procure sufficient insurance to
12		provide this indemnification if requested by the
13		office;
14	(7)	Agree to make available to the office all records the
15		applicant may have relating to the grant, to allow
16		state agencies to monitor the applicant's compliance
17		with this section; and
18	(8)	Comply with other requirements the office may
19		prescribe.
20	S	-4 Gun violence prevention special fund. (a) There
21	shall be	established in the state treasury the gun violence



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prevention special fund, to be administered by the office of gun violence prevention, into which shall be deposited all moneys received by the office in the form of:

4 (1) Grants;

5 (2) Donations; and

6 (3) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund.
7 (b) Moneys in the gun violence prevention special fund
8 shall be used for the awarding of grants to organizations to
9 conduct community-based gun violence intervention initiatives
10 pursuant to section -3.

(c) The office shall submit an annual report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session on the sources of moneys deposited into the fund and expenditures of moneys from the fund.

15 § -5 Gun violence resource bank; duties. (a) The 16 office shall create and maintain a resource bank of regularly 17 updated and accurate materials and resources as a repository for 18 data, research, and statistical information regarding gun 19 violence in the State.

20 (b) As part of maintaining the resource bank, the office21 shall:

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1	(1)	Assi	st researchers who are seeking information about
2		gun	violence in the State;
3	(2)	Coll	aborate with researchers, including organizations
4		that	conduct gun violence research, to:
5		(A)	Identify gaps in available data needed for gun
6			violence prevention research and develop
7			strategies to improve relevant data collection in
8			the State;
9		(B)	Use existing available research to enhance
10			evidence-based gun violence prevention tools and
11			resources available to communities in the State;
12			and
13		(C)	Improve the understanding of the disproportionate
14			barriers to safety from gun violence by
15			encouraging disaggregation of data by race and
16			ethnicity when research is conducted; and
17	(3)	Prom	ote new and relevant research regarding gun
18		viol	ence prevention and, if possible, make this
19		rese	arch accessible to researchers and the public.
20	S	-6 R	eporting. The office shall submit an annual
21	report to	the	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the



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convening of each regular session that contains a summary of its 1 2 activities during the preceding year, including: 3 (1) Grants awarded; 4 (2)The office's engagement with community entities and 5 other stakeholders; and (3) Any other findings and recommendations, including any 6 7 proposed legislation. 8 -7 Rules. The office shall adopt rules pursuant to S 9 chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this chapter." 10 SECTION 2. Section 134C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "[{] §134C-1[}] Gun violence and violent crimes commission; 13 established. There is established the gun violence and violent crimes commission that shall be placed within the [department of 14 15 the attorney general] department of law enforcement for administrative purposes only." 16 17 SECTION 3. Section 134C-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 18 19 "(a) The [attorney-general] director of law enforcement or the [attorney general's] director's designee shall coordinate 20

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1 and serve as the chair of the gun violence and violent crimes
2 commission."

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3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7 year 2026-2027 to be deposited into the gun violence prevention
8 special fund.

9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the gun violence
10 prevention special fund the sum of \$ or so much
11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
13 2026-2027 for the awarding of grants to organizations to conduct
14 community-based gun violence intervention initiatives.

15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of 16 gun violence prevention for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

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2026-2027 for the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of
 personnel and the establishment of a gun violence resource bank.
 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
 gun violence prevention for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2077.
