A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the widespread use 2 of illegal fireworks poses an extreme danger and lethal risk to public health and safety, resulting in fires, serious burn 3 injuries, and fatalities to innocent bystanders. The cost to 4 the community far outweighs any intrinsic benefit, as numerous 5 lives have been lost over the years from the use of illegal 6 fireworks. In addition, the potential for wildfires in this 7 time of climate change is a real and present danger and is a top 8 priority for all levels of government today. 9

10 The legislature further finds that fireworks-related tragedies, including the Aliamanu New Year's Eve explosion of 11 12 2024 that claimed at least six lives, seriously impact entire neighborhoods in urban Honolulu and across the State. Fireworks 13 14 also emit excessive smoke and other toxins into the air, making breathing difficult for thousands of Hawaii residents with 15 respiratory ailments. Noise from loud fireworks traumatizes 16 17 many residents, particularly war veterans who may suffer from

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post-traumatic stress from being in combat. Pets and vulnerable
 species in their natural habitats also suffer each holiday
 season when fireworks noise and environmental pollution levels
 are especially high.

5 The legislature recognizes that, with the increase in fireworks-related calls, public safety agencies are heavily 6 strained to maintain adequate response levels for other critical 7 emergencies, which adds to the cost of state and county 8 resources that could be used for natural disasters and other 9 emergencies. These agencies are often overwhelmed and are not 10 able to stop the thousands of illegal fireworks being used, 11 making it a death trap for thousands of innocent lives who are 12 13 not involved in illegal fireworks use.

14 The legislature also finds that the State's communities 15 deserve to live in peace and security without the public safety 16 risk and disruptive impact of illegal fireworks. There can be 17 no more gray areas when lives are lost while this black market 18 flourishes.

19 The legislature believes that intelligence-led policing and 20 criminal surveillance of illegal fireworks can be effective 21 approaches in deterring the use of illegal fireworks. An

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1	investment of funds to conduct sting operations by law
2	enforcement to enforce fireworks ordinances or laws on Oahu is
3	one of the first steps to effectively reducing the use of
4	illegal fireworks in the State.
5	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
6	funds to the department of law enforcement for:
7	(1) Sting operations on Oahu to enforce fireworks
8	ordinances or laws;
9	(2) An explosives and firearms laboratory on Oahu;
10	(3) A new explosive enforcement section, including
11	staffing, within the department's criminal
12	investigation division; and
13	(4) A fireworks program to provide educational campaigns
14	for public safety and awareness of fireworks through
15	advertising and promotional videos.
16	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
18	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
19	the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary
20	for fiscal year 2026-2027 for the department of law enforcement

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1 to conduct sting operations on Oahu to enforce chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 2 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 3 of law enforcement for the purposes of this Act. 4 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 6 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 8 year 2026-2027 for an explosives and firearms laboratory on 9 10 Oahu. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 11 of law enforcement for the purposes of this Act. 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 14 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 15 the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary 16 for fiscal year 2026-2027 for a new explosive enforcement 17

18 division within the criminal investigation section of the

19 department of law enforcement, including:

20 (1) \$ for six full-time equivalent (6.0 FTE)
21 exempt investigator V positions;

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1 (2) \$ for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) 2 exempt investigator VI position; and 3 (3) \$ for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) 4 account clerk III position. 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of law enforcement for the purposes of this Act. 6 7 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 9 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 11 year 2026-2027 for a fireworks program to provide educational 12 campaigns for public safety and awareness of fireworks through 13 advertising and promotional videos. 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 15 of law enforcement for the purposes of this Act. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050. 16
