A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that art feeds the human
- 2 spirit and offers priceless value. Art inspires, educates, and
- 3 challenges individuals to think differently, while making the
- 4 world a more beautiful and interesting place. The legislature
- 5 further finds that Hawaii was the first state in the nation to
- 6 adopt a percent-for-art law through Act 298, Session Laws of
- 7 Hawaii 1967 (Act 298), which designated one per cent of
- 8 construction costs of new buildings for the acquisition of works
- 9 of art. The purpose of Act 298 was to beautify state buildings
- 10 and increase public access to the arts.
- 11 The legislature further finds that recent efforts have
- 12 focused on the expansion of programs to include performing arts
- 13 and other initiatives to enhance an array of arts programming
- 14 across the State. Even as programs evolve and change over the
- 15 years, it is imperative that sound financial management be
- 16 exercised to ensure the stability of factors that may affect the
- 17 State's creditworthiness.

	(3)	All amounts to be transferred to the special lund	
2		pursuant to subsection (c); and	
3	(4)	All interest earned on moneys deposited in the special	
4		fund.	
5	(b)	Moneys in the performing arts special fund shall be	
6	expended	by the foundation for the coordination, planning,	
7	promotion	, marketing, and execution of performing arts events.	
8	<u>(c)</u>	Each state agency shall calculate an amount equal to	
9	one per cent of all ticket sales from concerts held at state		
10	venues un	der its ownership and management and transfer that	
11	amount into the performing arts special fund account. The		
12	comptroller shall track amounts due from each agency as provided		
13	in this subsection.		
14	(d)	For the purposes of this section:	
15	"Con-	cert" means a live, staged musical performance, comedy	
16	act, or o	ther specialty act or performance featuring any number	
17	of performers that occurs in front of an audience.		
18	"Per	forming arts" includes arts or skills that are intended	
19	to be per	formed for an audience, including but not limited to	
20	dance, si	nging, musical performances, and theater.
