A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to part XII to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§291C- Safe riding behavior; electric bicycles. (a)
5	All electric bicycles shall be operated only with all wheels on
6	the ground at all times, facing forward, and with the operator
7	seated with one leg on each side of the seat; provided that it
8	is not a violation of this subsection if the wheels lose contact
9	with the ground briefly due to the conditions of the road
10	surface or other circumstances beyond the control of the
11	operator.
12	(b) The following shall be prohibited while operating an
13	electric bicycle:
14	(1) Operating an electric bicycle in an unsafe manner or
15	engaging in exhibition driving on any public street,
16	alley, or other public right of way; provided that
17	this paragraph shall not apply to a person engaging in

1		exhibition riding as part of a parade, tournament, or
2		other activity permitted by a state or county
3		<pre>government agency;</pre>
4	(2)	Standing or kneeling on any seat, riding on the
5		handlebars, or engaging in any other non-standing or
6		non-standard riding position; and
7	(3)	Engaging in any other maneuver that endangers the
8		operator or any person.
9	<u>§291</u>	C- Operating a high-speed electric device. No
10	person sh	all operate a high-speed electric device on a public
11	roadway,	bicycle lane, travel paths, and other designated areas,
12	such as s	treets, highways, and sidewalks."
13	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended b	y adding two new sections to part XIII to be
15	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:
16	" <u>§29</u>	1C- Electric bicycles; labeling. Manufacturers and
17	distribut	ors of electric bicycles shall apply a label that is
18	permanent	ly affixed, in a prominent location, to each electric
19	bicycle.	The label shall contain the classification number, top
20	assisted	speed, and motor wattage of the electric bicycle.

17	or moped upon a bicycle lane or bicycle path, except upon a
18	permanent or authorized temporary driveway, or park any vehicle
19	upon a bicycle lane or bicycle path; provided that any vehicle
20	may be driven or parked in a bicycle lane or bicycle path as
21	applicable if[+] it is:

1	(1)	[It is in] In the process of executing a legal turn,
2		lane change, or parking maneuver;
3	(2)	[It is an] An authorized emergency vehicle performing
4		the functions under section 291C-26;

- 7 (e) No person shall operate an electric foot scooter or
- 8 electric micro mobility device that is carrying any other
- 9 person, nor shall any person other than the operator ride upon
- 10 an electric foot scooter.
- 11 (f) No person operating an electric foot scooter or
- 12 electric micro mobility device shall carry any package, bundle,
- 13 or article that prevents the use of both hands in the control
- 14 and operation of the electric foot scooter.
- 15 (g) Any electric foot scooter or electric micro mobility
- 16 device used from thirty minutes after sunset until thirty
- 17 minutes before sunrise shall meet the specifications of and
- 18 requirements for lamps and other equipment on bicycles as set
- 19 out in section 291C-147; provided that in lieu of the
- 20 requirement of section 291C-147(b), every electric foot scooter

- 1 or electric micro mobility device shall be equipped with a
- 2 lighted lamp that is visible from the rear.
- 3 (h) No person shall operate an electric foot scooter or
- 4 electric micro mobility device at a speed other than is
- 5 reasonable and prudent and having regard to the actual and
- 6 potential hazards and conditions then existing; provided that no
- 7 person shall operate an electric foot scooter or electric micro
- 8 mobility device at a speed greater than fifteen miles per hour.
- (i) Any person who operates an electric foot scooter or
- 10 electric micro mobility device recklessly in disregard of the
- 11 safety of persons or property shall be assessed penalties as set
- 12 forth in section 291C-161(b).
- 13 (j) A person or entity that provides electric foot
- 14 scooters or electric micro mobility devices for hire shall not
- 15 rent or lease an electric foot scooter or electric micro
- 16 mobility device to any person unless:
- 17 (1) Each renter or lessee that is under the age of
- 18 [sixteen] eighteen wears a safety helmet, as required
- by subsection (d), while operating the electric foot
- scooter[+] or electric micro mobility device; and

1	(2) Each renter or lessee is provided with a copy of the
2	electric foot scooter and electric micro mobility
3	device ordinances or rules that have been adopted by
4	the applicable county.
5	(k) Electric foot scooters and electric micro mobility
6	device shall only be stored or docked at specific locations that
7	shall be authorized by the counties."
8	SECTION 8. Section 291C-143.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"[{]§291C-143.5[] Low-speed electric bicycles;] <u>Electric</u>
11	<u>bicycle</u> operator age. No person under the age of fifteen shall
12	operate [a low-speed] a class 3 electric bicycle [as defined
13	under title 15 United States Code section 2085]. Class 1
14	electric bicycles and class 2 electric bicycles may be operated
15	by any individual, regardless of age."
16	SECTION 9. Section 291C-145, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
18	"(g) No person shall ride a bicycle equipped with a motor
19	or class 3 electric bicycle on any sidewalk[+]; provided that a
20	person may ride a class 1 electric bicycle or class 2 electric
21	bicycle on a sidewalk at a speed not exceeding ten miles per

- 4 SECTION 10. Section 291C-150, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 8 property unless that person is wearing a properly fitted and
- 9 fastened bicycle helmet that has been tested by a nationally

- 12 Safety Network, and is designed to fit the user and protect
- 13 against head trauma. This requirement also applies to a person
- 14 who rides upon a bicycle while in a restraining seat that is
- 15 attached to the bicycle or who rides in a trailer towed by the
- 16 bicycle."
- 17 SECTION 11. Section 291C-197, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "\$291C-197 [Driving mopeds on bicycle] Restrictions for
- 20 bicycle lanes and paths. [(a) Wherever bicycle lanes are

1	provided on the roadway, moped drivers shall use such bicycle
2	lanes.
3	$\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{(a)}}$ The director of transportation by rule and $[\frac{\text{the}}{\text{c}}]$
4	counties by ordinance may, with respect to bicycle paths under

7	ordinarily observant person indicating the restriction or

12	SECTION 12. Section 286-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by deleting the definition of "bicycle".

16	any person may ride, having two tandem wheels sixteen
17	inches in diameter or greater, and including any
18	device generally recognized as a bicycle though
19	equipped with two front or two rear wheels; or
20	(2) A low-speed electric bicycle, as defined under title
21	15 United States Code section 2085."]

Report Title:

Electric Bicycles; Electric Micro Mobility Devices; Regulation; Electric Mobility Devices; High-Speed Electric Device

Description:

Requires all bicycles equipped with motors to be operated only with all wheels on the ground at all times, with certain exceptions. Prohibits certain actions while operating a bicycle equipped with a motor. Prohibits the operation of high-speed electric devices in certain locations. Requires manufacturers and distributors to apply a label to electric bicycles. Requires distributors to place a sign at or near the point of sale regarding electric bicycles. Defines "electric bicycle" in place of "low-speed electric bicycle". Defines "electric micro mobility device" and requires the same regulations as electric foot scooters to apply to electric micro mobility devices. Prohibits a person from riding a class 3 electric bicycle on a sidewalk. Authorizes a person to ride a class 1 or class 2 electric bicycle on a sidewalk at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour. Prohibits a person from operating a bicycle or electric foot scooter under the age of eighteen without a helmet. Repeals the requirement that moped drivers use bicycle lanes. Substitutes the word "motor drive cycle" with the word "motor scooter". Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
