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         SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
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    the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
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    37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
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    that the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year
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    2024-2025 has already been exceeded by $8,551,795, or one per
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    cent. In addition, the appropriations contained in this Act
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    will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal
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    year 2024-2025 to be further exceeded by $

            per cent. The reasons for exceeding the general fund

    expenditure ceiling are that the appropriation made in this Act

    is necessary to serve the public interest and to meet the needs
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    addressed by this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 5. The sums hereinabove may be paid to the
- 2 respective persons, firms, corporations, or entities for the
- 3 satisfaction or settlement of the respectively identified cases,
- 4 and in several amounts hereinabove set forth or in lesser
- 5 amounts deemed appropriate, upon checks issued by the
- 6 comptroller; provided that departments shall obtain the approval
- 7 of the attorney general before payment of any claim may be made.
- 8 SECTION 6. Notwithstanding the sums hereinabove stated as
- 9 interest upon judgments against the State, payment of interest
- 10 shall be limited to the period from the date of the judgment, if
- 11 applicable, to thirty days after the effective date of this Act,
- 12 as provided in section 662-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those
- 13 cases to which the statute applies.
- 14 SECTION 7. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
- 15 appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
- 16 June 30, 2026, shall lapse.
- 17 SECTION 8. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 18 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 19 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 20 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the

- 1 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 2 of this Act are severable.
- 3 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
