

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO INCLUDE A STATEMENT ON DESECRATION LAWS IN THE PLANT AND ANIMAL DECLARATION FORM.

1 WHEREAS, section 150A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 2 any passenger, officer, and crew member of an aircraft or vessel 3 originating from certain areas, such as the continental United 4 States, and embarking in Hawaii to complete the State of Hawaii 5 Plant and Animal Declaration Form; and

7 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration 8 Form requires the passenger, officer, or crew member to disclose 9 whether or not they are bringing certain articles, such as 10 plants and animals, into the State and is used by the Hawaii 11 Department of Agriculture to ensure compliance with state 12 importation laws and rules; and

14 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration 15 Form include information about federal, and state laws on 16 protected, indigenous, endangered, and threatened wildlife; and 17

18 WHEREAS, in coordination to the State of Hawaii Plant and 19 Animal Declaration Form, the digital Akamai Arrival Program 20 would be an additional media used to facilitate the same 21 functions as the preceding program once it is fully rolled out; 22 and

24 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration 25 Form also includes the Hawaii Tourism Authority's Domestic 26 Visitors' Basic Characteristics Survey, which has been a 27 critical component of the Hawaii Tourism Authority's research 28 objective of collecting and reporting statistics from domestic 29 visitors to Hawaii, has been an extremely effective survey 30 instrument with a tremendous sample size for more than twenty

years, and also provides the Hawaii Department of Agriculture 1 2 with an additional tool to assist in monitoring and preventing invasive species from reaching the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, many visitors to Hawaii may be unaware of the 5 various federal, state, and county laws, rules, and ordinances 6 that protect public monuments and structures they may visit 7 while in the State, including but not limited to Native Hawaiian 8 cultural sites, burial grounds, and places of worship; and 9 10 WHEREAS, individuals required to complete the State of 11 Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration Form are a large, captive 12 audience, making the form an opportune method of also notifying 13 visitors of the laws against desecration; now, therefore, 14 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 18 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Agriculture is requested to include on the State of Hawaii Plant 19 and Animal Declaration Form a section for each individual 20 21 required to complete the form to acknowledge and affirm that the individual: 22 23 (1) Is aware of the existence of various federal, state, 24 25 and county laws, rules, and ordinances that protect public monuments and structures, including but not 26 27 limited to Native Hawaiian cultural sites, burial 28 grounds, and places of worship; 29 30 (2) Is aware of the federal and state laws on protected, indigenous, endangered, and threatened wildlife; and 31 32 33 (3)Is aware of ways to learn more about those laws, rules, and ordinances; and 34 35 That the individual will heed those laws, rules, and 36 (4) 37 ordinances; and 38 39 (5) Notes that once the Akamai Arrival Program is underway 40 that the intent of this resolution be facilitated 41 using the program; and 42 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Regional Director of 44
