HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO STRENGTHEN FARM-TO-SCHOOL INITIATIVES.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaiʻi currently imports nearly eighty-five to
2	ninety percent of its food, making the State vulnerable to
3	external supply chain disruptions; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, farm-to-school programs provide an opportunity to
6	increase local food procurement and resilience, reduce Hawai'i's
7	reliance on imported goods, and strengthen the State's
8	agricultural economy; and
9	WURDERG Ret 175 Generics Level of Hereit 2021 established
10	WHEREAS, Act 175, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, established
11 12	a goal for at least thirty percent of school meal ingredients to be sourced locally by 2030; and
12	be sourced rocarry by 2000, and
13	WHEREAS, significant barriers continue to stifle progress
15	in meeting the local food procurement goal, including
16	procurement regulations, distribution logistics, and
17	inconsistent farmer-school partnerships; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, expanding local farm procurement in farm-to-school
20	initiatives would support Hawai'i's small and medium-sized farms;
21	and

23	WHEREAS, prioritizing the procurement of locally grown
24	Native Hawaiian crops, such as kalo, 'uala, and ulu, aligns with
25	Hawai'i's commitment to food sovereignty, climate resilience, and
26	indigenous agricultural practices; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, increasing local farm procurement in schools would
29	provide stable, institutional markets for Hawai'i farmers,
30	thereby fostering economic growth and workforce development in
31	the State; now, therefore,
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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 2 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that the Department of Education is urged to take 3 4 immediate action to strengthen local farm-to-school initiatives; 5 and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 8 requested to: 9 10 (1)Streamline the procurement process to make it easier for small- and medium-scale farmers to sell to 11 schools, including simplifying contracting 12 requirements and increasing flexibility in sourcing 13 policies; 14 15 Develop a statewide database of local farms that are (2) 16 eligible and interested in supplying food for school 17 meals to facilitate farm-to-school connections; 18 19 (3) 20 Increase financial incentives for schools to purchase locally sourced food through grant programs, 21 subsidies, or farm-to-school budget allocations; and 22 23 Ensure culturally appropriate foods, such as kalo, 24 (4) 25 'uala, and ulu, are incorporated into school meal programs; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 28 29 requested to submit a report on its progress, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 30 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Superintendent of 34 35 Education, and Chairperson of the Board of Education. 36 37 OFFERED BY: Ung Komos 38
