HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF LIMITING THE COSTS OF PROJECT AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT IN EACH STATE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT TO TEN PERCENT OF THE TOTAL COST OF THE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the State expends more than \$1 billion per year on 1 capital improvement projects, including construction or 2 renovation of roads, buildings, harbors, and airports; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Honolulu has some of the highest construction 5 costs in the world due, in part, to the high cost of 6 transporting goods to Hawaii, the cost of fuel, and high labor 7 8 costs; and 9 WHEREAS, the costs for project and construction management, 10 which traditionally should account for seven to eleven percent 11 of a project, have increased significantly over the last decade, 12 with some contractors charging as much as fifteen percent of a 13 project's cost for management expenses; and 14 15 WHEREAS, being able to control rising construction costs 16 would help to more efficiently use state funds; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 20 of 2025, that the Department of Accounting and General Services 21 is requested to study the feasibility of limiting the costs of 22 project and construction management costs in each state 23 24 construction project to ten percent of the total cost of the

25 project; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 28 and General Services is requested to submit a report of its 29 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 30 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 31 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026; and
