A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
2	agriculture's existing agricultural statistics program plays a
3	crucial role in providing producers and policymakers with
4	essential data to guide short-term decision making and long-term
5	strategic planning. In fact, the department of agricultural has
6	a statutory duty and also a contractual obligation with the
7	United Stated Department of Agriculture to ensure robust data
8	collection and reporting across the State. However, the
9	department has experienced several shortcomings in the
10	agricultural statistics program, including limited access to
11	accurate and timely agricultural data and outdated collection,
12	analysis, and dissemination of agricultural statistics, which
13	results in limited insights to data that is critical to the
14	movement of agricultural goods into and within the State.
15	The legislature further finds that in 2024, the department
16	of agriculture launched a statewide process to address key
17	economic challenges facing the agricultural sector and developed

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1	snort-ter	m actions and a long-term strategy aimed at addressing
2	the short	comings of its statistics program and other goals, such
3	as boosti	ng local product availability and expanding market
4	capacity.	The objectives of the long-term strategy are to:
5	(1)	Collect, analyze, and report data and trends on the
6		intra- and inter-island production, distribution, and
7		sale of select agricultural products;
8	(2)	Provide producers with the information needed to make
9		informed decisions about planting, scaling operations
10		and exploring new growth or market opportunities;
11	(3)	Provide other decisionmakers with key analyses of
12		production and production opportunities, trends, and
13		growth to better allocate public resources to support
14		agriculture and the public; and
15	(4)	Support the strategic growth and development of
16		Hawaii's agricultural sector by enhancing the
17		statistics program's data collection, analysis, and
18		reporting capabilities.
19	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to revitalize and
20	enhance t	he department of agriculture's agricultural statistics

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2	program a	nd appropriating funds for the program.
3	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 148, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
5	to read a	s follows:
6		"PART . AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS
7	§148	- Agricultural statistics program. The department
8	of agricu	lture shall:
9	(1)	Collect data, provide analysis, and report on the
10		intra- and inter-island transportation of fresh fruit
1		and vegetable products;
12	(2)	Develop and maintain electronic systems for capturing
13		and analyzing data on the intra- and inter-island
14		transportation of fresh fruit and vegetable products;
15		and
16	(3)	Establish a structured rotation schedule for expanded
17		consistent, sector-specific surveys to collect
18		comprehensive data on key agricultural activities,
19		including:
20		(A) Agricultural theft;
21		(B) Agricultural tourism;

20	SECT	ION 3	. There is appropriated out of the general
21	revenues	of th	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$880,000 or so much



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1	thereof as	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
2	same sum o	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
3	2026-2027	for the following:
4	(1)	\$170,000 for the establishment of two full-time
5		equivalent (2.0 FTE) agricultural economist positions
6	(2)	\$280,000 for the establishment of four full-time
7		equivalent (4.0 FTE) research statistician positions;
8	(3)	\$130,000 for the establishment of secured office
9		space, equipment, the development of electronic data
10		collection systems, and program expenses for six
1		islands; and
12	(4)	\$300,000 for contracted specialty surveys to be
13		conducted by third-party entities, focusing on
14		critical agricultural data needs.
15	The s	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
16	of agricul	lture for the purposes of this Act.
17	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
