A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER POLLUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 200-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$200-14 Violation of chapter or rules; penalty. (a) Anv
- 4 person who violates any provision in this chapter, or rule
- 5 adopted by the department, relating to boating accidents,
- 6 reckless or unauthorized operation of a vessel, unauthorized
- 7 mooring of a vessel, unauthorized commercial activity,
- 8 unauthorized camping within state small boat harbors or boating
- facilities, animal abandonment within state small boat harbors 9
- 10 or boating facilities, or creation of animal colonies within
- 11 state small boat harbors or boating facilities shall be quilty
- 12 of a petty misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$1,000.
- 13 (b) Any person who violates any rule adopted by the
- 14 department under this part regulating vehicular parking or
- 15 traffic movement shall have committed a traffic infraction as
- 16 set forth in chapter 291D, the adjudication of which shall be
- **17** subject to the provisions contained [therein.] in chapter 291D.



- 1 A person found to have committed a traffic infraction shall be
- 2 fined not more than:
- 3 (1) \$100 for a first violation;
- 4 (2) \$200 for a second violation; and
- 5 (3) \$500 for a third or subsequent violation.
- 6 [(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), any
- 7 person who knowingly or intentionally violates any rule adopted
- 8 by the department relating to unauthorized discharge, dumping,
- 9 or abandoning, in any state boating facility or state waters, of
- 10 any petroleum product, hazardous material, or sewage in
- 11 violation of the state water quality standards established by
- 12 the department of health, shall be fined not more than \$10,000
- 13 for each day of violation, and any vessel, the agents, owner, or
- 14 crew of which violate the rules of the department shall be fined
- 15 not more than \$10,000 for each day or instance of violation, or
- 16 sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not more than thirty
- 17 days, or both. Each day or instance of each violation shall be
- 18 deemed a separate offense. Additionally, the agents, owner, or
- 19 crew of any vessel that violates the rules of the department
- 20 shall be fined not more than \$10,000 for each day of violation.

- 1 (d) (c) As a condition of probation pursuant to sections
- 2 706-623 and 706-624, or as a condition to the suspension of any
- 3 criminal penalties, the environmental court may provide that the
- 4 defendant refrain from operating any vessel, including but not
- 5 limited to any thrill craft or vessel engaged in parasailing or
- 6 water sledding, in specified geographical areas of the waters of
- 7 the State.
- **8** [(e)] (d) For the purposes of this section, "operate",
- 9 "parasailing", "thrill craft", "vessel", "water sledding", and
- 10 "waters of the State" have the same meaning as those terms are
- 11 defined in section 200-23."
- 12 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 3. The Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Water Pollution Offenses; Enforcement

Description:

Repeals duplicative and potentially confusing penalties for water pollution offenses in section 200-14, HRS, and thereby clarifies that enforcement of criminal water pollution offenses remains under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health, rather than the Department of Land and Natural Resources. (CD1)

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
