A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I 2 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for 3 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of 4 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii. 5 PART II 6 SECTION 2. There are appropriated from the sources of 7 funding indicated below to collective bargaining statewide 8 (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may be 9 necessary to fund for fiscal biennium 2023-2025 all collective 10 bargaining cost items in the agreement negotiated with the 11 exclusive representative of collective bargaining units (2), 12 (3), (4), (8), (9), (13), and (14) and their excluded 13 counterparts. The amounts are for a negotiated settlement for 14 the executive branch and the university of Hawaii, and an 15 arbitration award for the department of education. These 16 amounts are in addition to the amounts provided in Act 49, 17 Session Laws of Hawaii 2024:

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1	SECTION 10. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act	
2	that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2025, shall	
3	lapse as of that date.	
4	SECTION 11. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of	
5	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,	
6	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the	
7	appropriations from previous years have caused the state general	
8	fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded	
9	by \$ or per cent. In addition, the appropriation	
10	contained in this Act will cause the general fund expenditure	
11	ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further exceeded by	
12	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the general	
13	fund expenditure ceiling are that:	
14	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to	
15	serve the public interest; and	
16	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs	
17	addressed by this Act.	
18	SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

DEPARTMENT: Budget and Finance

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING EMERGENCY

APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST

ITEMS.

PURPOSE: To make emergency appropriations for

collective bargaining cost items and other public employment costs for the members of Units (2), (3), (4), (8), (9), (13), and (14) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal year 2024-2025 pursuant to resolving issues

concerning hazard pay.

MEANS: By the submittal of a specific appropriation

measure.

JUSTIFICATION: This bill will provide appropriations to

fund temporary hazard pay settlements for State of Hawaii Executive Branch, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, the University of Hawaii, and the Judiciary, as well as an arbitration award for the Department of Education with the Hawaii Government Employees Association as provided by Act 49, Session Laws of Hawaii 2024. It has been determined that the costs to fund those agreements and award will be higher than

previously estimated.

This bill is being proposed to fund those

additional costs.

The funding requested in this bill might cause the general fund expenditure ceiling to be exceeded.

Impact on the public: Cooperative relations between the government and its employees help protect the public by assuring effective and orderly operations of government. Requiring collective bargaining

negotiations for wages, hours, and conditions of employment, along with the merit principle, helps ensure public funds are spent efficiently while protecting the rights of public employees.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
This bill will provide appropriations for
pay raise and other negotiated cost items
that were not included in departments'
operating budget requests due to the unknown
costs of the temporary hazard pay
settlements and arbitration award during the
budget request preparation period.
