A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need for community readiness centers in various communities to ensure 2 3 emergency preparedness. A community readiness center will serve 4 as a place for residents to receive emergency preparedness training and emergency information, supplies, and basic medical 5 6 care during and after an emergency event. The community 7 readiness centers will also be used to store and refrigerate 8 medical supplies and provide a place for residents to charge electrical devices and access the internet. The establishment 9 10 of these community readiness centers will require partnerships 11 between numerous agencies and private entities and the 12 legislature finds that the Hawaii emergency management agency is 13 the most capable agency to coordinate the establishment of 14 community readiness centers.

15 The legislature further finds that community readiness 16 center sites should be carefully identified to ensure proper 17 connection to the electrical grid and be equipped with a solar

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and back-up battery storage system to guard against power
 outages. Communities should be directly involved in the
 location and design of community readiness centers in their
 respective communities.

5 The legislature notes that the use of funds from the 6 environmental response, energy, and food security tax is 7 appropriate for this purpose. The legislature further finds 8 that the establishment of community readiness centers will 9 require dedicated funding and that there is a nexus between the 10 need for community readiness centers and the use of petroleum 11 and other fossil fuels. Therefore, it is appropriate to tax 12 petroleum and other fossil fuel usage to fund community 13 readiness centers.

14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

15 (1) Establish the community readiness centers program to16 be implemented and administered by the Hawaii

17 emergency management agency;

- 18 (2) Establish the community readiness centers special fund
- 19 for the implementation and administration of the
- 20 community readiness centers program;

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1	(3)	Rename the environmental response, energy, and food
2		security tax to the environmental response, energy,
3		food security, and resilience tax; and
4	(4)	Allocate portions of the environmental response,
5		energy, and food security tax into the community
6		readiness centers special fund.

15		multiple electrical charging stations, internet
16		access, and the capability to refrigerate medical
17		supplies at each community readiness center site; and
18	(5)	Obtain suitable emergency supplies, including
19		non-perishable food, and equip each community
20		readiness center site with emergency supplies.

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1	(c) The agency shall provide a selection criteria matrix
2	of standards necessary for constructing community readiness
3	centers in consultation with the Hawaii earthquake and tsunami
4	advisory committee and the State hazard mitigation forum to
5	identify geographic areas where community readiness centers
6	sites would be able to withstand natural disasters.
7	(d) The agency shall utilize the partnership established
8	through the Hawaii hazards awareness and resilience program to
9	maintain each of the community readiness centers.
10	<u>§127A-B</u> Community readiness centers special fund;
11	established. (a) There is established within the state
12	treasury the community readiness centers special fund, into
13	which shall be deposited:
14	(1) Appropriations made by the legislature;
15	(2) Interest earned on any moneys in the fund; and
16	(3) Moneys from the environmental response, energy, food
17	security, and resilience tax pursuant to section
18	243-3.5.
19	(b) Moneys in the fund shall be administered by the agency

16	SECT	ION 3. Section 128D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

8	SECT	ION 4. Section 201-12.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

15	(2)	Moneys appropriated to the fund by the legislature;

18	(4)	Moneys allotted to the fund from other sources,
19		including under section 196-6.5."

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SECTION 5. Section 243-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending its title and subsections (a) and (b) to
 read as follows:

4 "§243-3.5 Environmental response, energy, [and] food
5 security, and resilience tax; uses.

6 In addition to any other taxes provided by law, (a) 7 subject to the exemptions set forth in section 243-7, there is 8 hereby imposed a state environmental response, energy, [and] 9 food security, and resilience tax on each barrel or fractional 10 part of a barrel of petroleum product sold by a distributor to 11 any retail dealer or end user of petroleum product, other than a 12 refiner. The tax shall be \$1.05 on each barrel or fractional 13 part of a barrel of petroleum product that is not aviation fuel; 14 provided that of the tax collected pursuant to this subsection: (1) 5 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited 15 16 into the environmental response revolving fund 17 established under section 128D-2; 18 (2) 4 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited into the energy security special fund established 19

20 under section 201-12.8;

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1	(3)	5 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
2		into the energy systems development special fund
3		established under section 304A-2169.1;
4	(4)	3 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
5		into the electric vehicle charging system subaccount

15	(b)	In addition to subsection (a), the tax shall also be
16	imposed o	n each one million British thermal units of fossil fuel
17	sold by a	distributor to any retail dealer or end user, other
18	than a re	finer, of fossil fuel. The tax shall be 19 cents on
19	each one :	million British thermal units of fossil fuel; provided
20	that of t	he tax collected pursuant to this subsection:

15		readiness centers special fund established pursuant to
16		section 127A-B.
17	The	tax imposed by this subsection shall be paid by the

19	SECT	ION 6. Section 304A-2169.1, Hawaii Revised Statues, is
20	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

9	SECT	ION 7. The Hawaii emergency management agency shall
10	submit a	report of its findings and recommendations, including
11	any propo	sed legislation, to the legislature no later than
12	twenty da	ys prior to the convening of the regular session of
13	2026. Th	e report shall contain information relating to:
14	(1)	The timeline for identifying community readiness
15		centers, both public and private;
16	(2)	The use of funding sources;
17	(3)	Any partnerships with federal and county agencies and
18		community groups;
19	(4)	Any collaboration and communication with stakeholders;
20	(5)	The annual projected amount of funding based on
21		sources of revenue;

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1 (6) Any other relevant information about the community 2 readiness centers program. 3 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section 2 and referenced by section 5 of this Act, the revisor of 4 statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the 5 6 letters used in designating the new sections in this Act. 7 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 9 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2077. 10
