### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 338-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§338-14.5 Copies of certificate; fees. The fees for certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or death 4 5 certificates issued by the department of health shall consist of \$10 for the first copy issued and \$4 for each copy issued 6 thereafter. These fees shall be collected for each single 7 8 request for certified copies. All fees received for the issuance of certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or 9 death certificates shall be remitted to the director of 10 Upon the receipt of remittances under this section, the 11 12 director of health shall deposit: **13** \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse (1) and child abuse special fund established under section 14 15 346-7.5; \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse 16 (2) and child abuse special account established under **17** section 601-3.6; 18

- 10 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the vital

### Report Title:

Department of Health; Fees; Vital Statistics Improvement Special Fund; Birth Defects Special Fund; Repeal

### Description:

Repeals the birth defects special fund and deposits a portion of fees for certified copies and marriage licenses into the vital statistics improvement special fund.

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

PURPOSE:

To repeal the birth defects special fund and redirect deposits from the birth defects special fund to the vital statistics improvement special fund; to redirect deposits for certified copies of vital records from the general fund to the vital statistics improvement special fund; and to appropriate funds out of the vital statistics improvement special fund.

MEANS:

Amend sections 338-14.5, 338-14.6(c), 572-5(a), and 572-5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS); and repeal section 321-426, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

Report No. 21-03 published by the Hawaii Office of the Auditor found that the birth defects special fund did not meet the criteria of a special fund, in part because there was no clear link between the birth defects program and marriage license fees, and recommended its repeal. Repealing the birth defects special fund will satisfy these concerns.

It is essential to redirect the deposits from the birth defects special fund into the vital statistics special fund to completely overhaul vital statistics business functions. There have previously been lengthy backlogs in customer requests due to a decades-old, unreliable computer system that drives a sub-optimal manual workflow, as well as overall increases in customer orders.

The redirection of deposits from the general fund to the vital statistics improvement special fund will provide a more reliable stream of resources to offset costs for the daily operations of the vital statistics

systems and to support modernization and automation of the system than a budget increase or appropriation would provide. The department processes approximately 125,000 customer requests a year, which is increasing steadily year after year due to a growing population and additional requirements for which vital records are essential, such as the REAL ID Act of 2005 (Pub.L. 109-13). Along with the increase in the number of transactions, the cost of security paper, printers and toner, postage, and other supplies continues to rise. Recovering a greater share of the fees for certified copies would allow the department to meet operational needs, and make more immediate investments in business operations, quality improvement, and customer service.

Furthermore, the deteriorating condition of bound volumes, some dating back to the Kingdom of Hawaii, prompt the need for digitization of those records to improve operations, such as genealogical research, and preservation for historical purposes. A larger share of the fees would permit interim preservation and protective actions to be taken, in concert with potential longer-term interventions. The additional revenue from fees provides more certainty and flexibility than a base budget appropriation.

Impact on the public: Additional efficiency and improved customer service is expected from redirecting additional deposits into the vital statistics improvement special fund.

While the department has prioritized requesting general funds to replace the moneys in the special fund, there may be a shortfall of funding for the birth defects surveillance and prevention program that may limit access to timely health intervention

if other funds cannot cover the loss of the marriage license fees.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Increased resources for the Department's
Office of Health Status Monitoring to
improve operations and preserve bound
volumes. Diminished resources for birth
defects programs for the Department's Family
Health Services Division if funds in the
base budget are not appropriated.

GENERAL FUND:

Reduction of approximately \$650,000 in deposits from fees for certified copies of vital records.

OTHER FUNDS:

Any unencumbered and unexpended balance in the birth defects special fund will be deposited into the vital statistics improvement special fund.
