A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOME CARE AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 321-14.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

 "\$321-14.8 Home care agencies; licensing. (a) Beginning

 July 1, 2010, each home care agency shall be licensed by the department of health to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of clients.
- 7 (b) The department of health shall adopt interim rules,
- 8 which shall be exempt from chapters 91 and 201M, to effectuate
- 9 the licensure of home care agencies; provided that the interim
- 10 rules shall remain in effect until the sooner of October 1,
- 11 2018, or the adoption of rules pursuant to chapters 91 and 201M
- 12 to:
- (1) Protect the health, safety, and civil rights ofclients of home care agencies; and
- 15 (2) Provide for the licensure of home care agencies.
- 16 (c) A service provider agency shall be exempt from the
- 17 licensing requirement of this section when services are
- 18 provided:

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1	(1)	Under contract for services with the city and county
2		of Honolulu, elderly affairs division; or
3	(2)	Exclusively to participants in the medicaid home and
4		community based services waiver, pursuant to section
5		1915(c) of the Social Security Act, by an agency
6		approved by the department of human services med-QUEST
7		division.
8	(d)	A home care agency shall only provide home care
9	services	or related tasks, functions, and activities in
10	accordance with its license, and shall not provide services	
11	authorized by chapter 457 unless those services are provided by	
12	a registe	red nurse, licensed practical nurse, or advanced
13	practice	registered nurse.
14	<u>(e)</u>	Violations of this section shall be subject to the
15	penalties	and remedies provided in this chapter and in rules
16	adopted b	y the department of health.

18	"Hom	e care agency" means a public or proprietary agency, a
19	private,	nonprofit organization, or a subdivision of an agency
20	or organi	zation, engaged in providing home care services to
21	clients i	n the client's residence. The term "home care agency"
22	does not	apply to an individual, including an individual who is

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1 .	incorporated as a business, or is an unpaid or stipended

3	"Home care services" may include [but are not limited to]:		
4	(1) Personal care, including assistance with dressing,		
5	feeding, and personal hygiene to facilitate self-care;		
6	(2) Homemaker assistance, including housekeeping,		
7	shopping, and meal planning and preparation; and		
8	(3) Respite care and assistance and support provided to		
9	the family."

PURPOSE:

To clarify that the scope of services

authorized to be provided under a home care

agency (HCA) license does not include services that otherwise require a license pursuant to chapter 457, Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

MEANS:

Amend section 321-14.8, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

This bill is needed to clarify that the Department may take enforcement action against HCAs that provide services outside

of the scope of their license. Some

operators of HCAs provide skilled nursing services to clients that are not rendered by a nurse licensed pursuant to chapter 457, HRS. Because the State Board of Nursing may

not have the authority to regulate unlicensed providers of nursing care

employed by HCAs, providing the Department with the authority to ensure appropriate services are provided will more effectively

protect patient safety.

Impact on the public: The bill will increase public safety by ensuring home care agencies do not exceed the scope of services allowed by their license.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Potential for more enforcement actions.
