A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that addressing mental health needs early in life is imperative for better health and well-being in adulthood. Adverse childhood experiences, various forms of trauma during a child's development, are linked to a greater likelihood of lifelong risky behaviors that can lead to chronic diseases and poor mental health, including depression, anxiety, and suicidality.

8 The importance of children and adolescent mental health was 9 emphasized during the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic 10 significantly impacted the social, emotional, and mental 11 well-being of youth globally. Hawaii children and adolescents, 12 like those in other states in the nation, were more likely to 13 have depression and anxiety after the first year of the COVID-19 14 pandemic.

15 The child and adolescent mental health division of the 16 department of health is the State's medicaid provider of 17 intensive mental health services for youth. Services provided

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by the division may be described as a multi-tiered and
multi-agency system of care.

3 The child and adolescent mental health division receives referrals from, and provides mental health services in 4 5 coordination and collaboration with, other state government agencies, as appropriate. For example, the division may receive 6 a client who is housed in a detention home, has been abused, and 7 has dropped out of school. The division will provide the child 8 9 with treatment and services in coordination with other state agencies, including the judiciary, child welfare services, and 10 department of education, that may be involved given the child's 11 circumstances. To minimize disruptions in the daily lives of 12 the clients and their families, the division provides its 13 clients with community-based services and supports by 14 contracting with mental health professionals who practice near 15 16 or in the communities where eligible children and adolescents 17 live.

18 The purpose of this Act is to clarify and update the 19 responsibilities of the child and adolescent mental health 20 division of the department of health to reflect the current

3	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding a new section to part XV to be appropriately		
5	designated and to read as follows:		
6	" <u>§321-</u> Definitions. As used in this part:		
7	"Client" means a child or adolescent who is receiving		
8	services from the child and adolescent mental health division.		
9	"Division" means the child and adolescent mental health		
10	division of the department of health."		
11	SECTION 3. Section 321-171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§321-171 Children's and adolescents' mental health		
14	services; department responsibility. It shall be the		
15	responsibility of the department of health to:		
16	(1) Provide preventative health services for children and		
17	[youth;] adolescents; and		
18	(2) Provide diagnostic and treatment services for		
19	emotionally disturbed children and [youth; and		
20	(3) Provide treatment and rehabilitative services for		
21	mentally ill children and youth.] adolescents.		

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1	[Such] <u>These</u> services shall be delivered [at the earliest
2	possible moment] as soon as reasonably possible after the need
3	for [such] <u>the</u> services is established. [All] <u>Subject to the</u>
4	availability of state or federal resources, eligible children
5	and [youth] <u>adolescents</u> between the ages of birth and seventeen
6	years shall receive the necessary mental health services to
7	[insure] <u>ensure</u> their proper and full development. [If there is
8	any adjudication or settlement of any legal action involving the
9	delivery of children's mental health services, the] The
10	department of health shall be responsible for the coordination
11	of carrying out the terms of [the] any judgment or settlement[$_{ au}$]
12	related to the delivery of children's and adolescents' mental
13	health services, as required by this section."
14	SECTION 4. Section 321-172, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§321-172 [Children's mental health services branch.]
17	Child and adolescent mental health division. There is
18	established within the department of health [, mental health
19	division, a children's] a child and adolescent mental health
20	[services branch] division, which shall coordinate the effective
21	and efficient delivery of mental health services to children and

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1 [vouth,] adolescents, including services provided by private nonprofit agencies under contract to the department of health, 2 and be responsible for the development and implementation of 3 centralized and highly specialized programs for children and 4 5 [youth.] adolescents." SECTION 5. Section 321-173, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 8 "§321-173 [Community mental health services] Family 9 guidance centers for children and [youth.] adolescents. [There 10 is established within each community mental health center a 11 children's mental health-services team which, The division 12 shall implement and administer family guidance centers. The 13 family guidance centers, in conjunction with public and private agencies, shall develop and provide a network of preventative, 14 early identification, screening, diagnostic, treatment, and 15 16 rehabilitative services for children and [youth] adolescents 17 based on the needs of each [geographic region] county in which 18 the [community mental health] family guidance center is located. The [children's mental health services teams] division shall 19 20 cooperate with and promote the coordination of the activities of 21 local public and private agencies servicing children and [youth]

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1	adolescents in their [particular geographic area.] county or the			
2	closest county that has resources and services that meet the			
3	<u>client's needs.</u> "			
4	SECTION 6. Section 321-175, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
5	amended to read as follows:			
6	"§321-175 Statewide [children's] <u>child and adolescent</u>			
7	mental health services plan. (a) Commencing [on September-1,			
8	$\frac{1980}{7}$] no later than twenty days before the convening of the			
9	regular session of 2027, and every [four] five years thereafter,			
10	the [children's mental health services branch, on or before			
11	September 1 of each four-year cycle,] division shall develop and			
12	[present] <u>submit</u> to the governor and the legislature[, as well			
13	as release for public inspection and comment,] a current			
14	statewide [children's] <u>child and adolescent</u> mental health			
15	services plan [which] <u>that</u> shall include:			
16	(1) [A survey of the children and youth in the State who			
17	are (A) in need of and (B) receiving mental health			
18	services showing the total number of such children and			
19	youth and their geographic distribution;] An			
20	assessment of the mental health needs of children and			
21	adolescents in the State;			

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1	(2)	[Identification of the public and private providers of
2		mental health services to children and youth; An
3		assessment of resources available to meet the mental
4		health needs of children and adolescents in the State;
5	(3)	[Identification-of-the-criteria and standards-for-the
6		treatment to be received by emotionally disturbed or
7		mentally ill children and youth;] Identification of
8		gaps between needs and available resources;
9	[(4)	A program for the recruitment, orientation, and in-
10		service training of personnel in community mental
11		health services to children and youth, and to allied
12		fields, including participation, as appropriate, by
13		institutions of higher learning, state and local
14		agencies, and other public and private agencies having
15		relevant expertise;
16	(5)]	(4) A description of the provisions for prevention,
17		[early identification,] diagnosis, screening, <u>and</u>
18		treatment, which is inclusive of [and] rehabilitation
19		[(including, with regard to treatment and
20		rehabilitation, services provided through inpatient,

1		outpatient, and community residential facilities) of
2		children and youth in need of mental health services;
3	(6) -	An implementation plan for providing mental health
4		services to all children and youth in the State in
5		each of the above mentioned areas; and
6	(7)	Any-additional matters which may be necessary or
7		appropriate, including recommendations for amendment
8		of laws, changes in administrative practices and
9		patterns of organization, and changes in levels and
10		patterns of financial support relating to children's
11		mental health services.]; and
12	(5)	Recommendations to the governor and the legislature on
13		how mental health needs of children and adolescents
14		can be met.
15	(b)	Prior to the submission of the statewide [children's]
16	child and	adolescent mental health services plan under
17	subsectio	n (a) to the governor and the legislature, the
18	departmen	t of health shall hold <u>public</u> hearings on the plan in
19	accordanc	e with [chapter 91.] <u>section 92-41.</u> There shall be at
20	least one	hearing in each county; [except] provided that the
21	city and	county of Honolulu shall have three hearings in

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1 strategic geographic locations to provide the widest exposure of 2 the plan to the population. 3 (c) Any amendments to the statewide [children's] child and adolescent mental health services plan shall be made after 4 5 public meetings held in accordance with [chapter 91.] subsection (b)." 6 7 SECTION 7. Section 321-176, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 repealed. ["§321-176 Biennial review of progress. Every two years, 9 starting January 1, 1979, the department of health, on or before 10 January 1 of each two-year-cycle, shall submit to the 11 12 legislature and the governor a report setting forth: 13 (1) A detailed analysis of the progress made-toward fulfilling-the statewide children's mental health 14 services plan developed under section 321-175; and 15 16 (2) Other matters which are necessary or appropriate, 17 including recommendations for any amendment to any 18 law, any change in the administrative practices and 19 patterns of organization, the current and prevailing 20 memoranda of agreement, and any change in the levels 21 and patterns of financial support."]

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SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
