# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that current baseline
- 2 reimbursements in commercial health insurance, medicaid, and
- 3 medicare plans are low and offer no cost of living increases or
- 4 overhead reimbursements for physicians. In addition, these
- 5 plans offer no increase in reimbursement rates to reflect years
- 6 of experience, as is common in other fields. The legislature
- 7 recognizes that without adequate reimbursement rates, physicians
- 8 may struggle to maintain a financially viable practice or may
- 9 refuse to provide care to patients utilizing those plans
- 10 altogether.

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- 11 The legislature further finds that many physicians are
- 12 opting out of private practice. Ten per cent of physicians in
- 13 Hawaii currently are in private practice. This compares with
- 14 seventy-five per cent of Hawaii physicians who were in private
- 15 practice ten years ago.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that primary care
- 17 physicians who provide services to med-QUEST recipients may



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- 1 continue to serve these recipients without experiencing a loss
- 2 of revenue.
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$20,000,000 or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 7 year 2026-2027 for direct payment to primary care physicians for
- 8 services provided to med-QUEST recipients.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 10 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
