A BILL FOR AN ACT

S.B. NO. 610

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RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there has been
 improvement in reducing the State's shortage of kindergarten
 through grade twelve teachers. The department of education
 reported one hundred sixty-six unfilled positions in the
 2024-2025 academic year, a staggering decrease from the more
 than one thousand unfilled positions reported during the
 2022-2023 academic year.

8 Despite this, education officials remain concerned about 9 future teacher shortages. Specifically, the legislature finds 10 that the State does not have a sustainable way to grow and 11 retain its teacher pool. Moreover, another wave of teacher 12 retirements is expected in the coming year.

While other states facing teacher shortages have used the
sale of lottery tickets to help provide a sustainable,
supplemental funding source for education, the legislature finds
that, for Hawaii, an appropriate solution is the establishment

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1	of a rounding-up program, in which residents may designate		
2	additional educational funding amounts on their utility bills.		
3	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a		
4	rounding up for teachers program, in which residents may round		
5	up the amount due on an electrical or water bill and designate		
6	those additional amounts to be used to provide additional		
7	compensation for teachers.		
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 54, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
9	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately		
10	designated and to read as follows:		
11	" <u>\$54- Rounding up for teachers program.</u> (a) Each		
12	board shall provide an option on each customer's utility bill		
13	for the customer to voluntarily:		
14	(1) Round up the total amount of the customer's water		
15	utility bill to the nearest dollar amount; or		
16	(2) Contribute a specific donation amount of the		
17	customer's choice,		
18	with the proceeds to be deposited into the rounding up for		
19	teachers' salaries special fund established pursuant to		
20	section 302A-		

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1	(b)	Each option described in subsection (a)(1) and (2)		
2	shall app	ear as a line item on the utility bill. The board		
3	shall clearly indicate that:			
4	(1)	Any moneys contributed will be deposited into the		
5		rounding up for teachers' salaries special fund for		
6		the purpose of providing additional compensation for		
7		department of education teachers; and		
8	(2)	Participation in the program is voluntary."		
9	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended b	y adding a new section to part III to be appropriately		
11	designate	d and to read as follows:		
12	" <u>§</u> 26	9- Electric utilities; rounding up for teachers		
13	program.	(a) Each electric utility shall provide an option on		
14	each cust	omer's utility bill for the customer to voluntarily:		
15	(1)	Round up the total amount of the customer's electric		
16		utility bill to the nearest dollar amount; or		
17	(2)	Contribute a specific donation amount of the		
18		customer's choice,		
19	with the	proceeds to be deposited into the rounding up for		
20	teachers'	salaries special fund established pursuant to section		
21	302A-	<u>.</u>		

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1	(b)	Each option described in subsection (a)(1) and (2)		
2	shall appe	ear as a line item on the utility bill. The electric		
3	utility shall clearly indicate that:			
4	(1)	Any moneys contributed will be deposited into the		
5		rounding up for teachers' salaries special fund for		
6		the purpose of providing additional compensation for

16	SECTI	CON 4. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by	v adding a new section to part III, subpart B, to be		
18	appropriat	ely designated and to read as follows:		
19	" <u>§302</u>	A- Rounding up for teachers' salaries special		
20	fund. (a)	There is established within the state treasury the		

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1	rounding	up for teachers' salaries special fund, into which
2	shall be	deposited:
3	(1)	All moneys received pursuant to sections 54- and
4		<u>269-</u> ; and
5	(2)	Any other appropriations, grants, or donations
6		received by the department and designated for deposit
7		into the fund.
8	(b)	Subject to appropriation by the legislature, the
9	departmen	t may use moneys in the fund to provide additional
10	compensat	ion for teachers, including through increases in
11	salaries	or bonuses.
12	(c)	The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to
13	establish	policies and procedures for the expenditure of moneys
14	from the	fund.
15	(d)	Any moneys deposited into the fund shall be in
16	addition	to and shall not supplant any portion of the base
17	budget of	the department of education."
18	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
20	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 to

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1 assist the counties in implementing section 2 of this Act; 2 provided that the moneys shall be expended as follows: 3 (1)County of Hawaii \$ 4 (2) County of Kauai \$ 5 (3) County of Maui Ś 6 (4) City and county of Honolulu Ŝ 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the respective 8 county for the purposes of this Act and shall constitute the 9 State's share of the cost of the mandated program under article 10 VIII, section 5, of the state constitution. 11 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025; 13 provided that sections 2 and 3 shall take effect on July 1, 14 2026. 15

Electric Utilities; County Boards of Water Supply; DOE; Teachers; Compensation; Round Up; Special Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes the rounding up for teachers' salaries special fund, to be administered by the Department of Education. Requires electric utilities and county boards of water supply to provide an option for customers to voluntarily round up their bill to the nearest dollar or provide a specific contribution amount. Deposits the proceeds into the rounding up for teachers' salaries special fund. Appropriates moneys.
