# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the coconut SECTION 1. 2 rhinoceros beetle, scientifically known as oryctes rhinoceros, 3 is an invasive species that threatens coconut palms and other 4 vegetation. The beetle bores into the crowns of coconut trees, 5 feeding on the sap and causing severe damage. The beetle's 6 appetite is not limited to coconut palms, and it threatens other 7 tropical plants such as hala, sugarcane, taro, banana, and 8 pineapple. From reduced property values and loss of tourism due 9 to dying palms to increased costs for pest control and tree 10 replacement, the economic consequences are vast and significant. 11 The legislature further finds that the coconut rhinoceros 12 beetle endangers the State's cultural heritage by damaging 13 plants, including hala and taro, that are integral to native 14 Hawaiian practices. The protection of these plants is essential 15 for preserving local traditions and maintaining a balanced 16 ecosystem. Wreaking havoc since it was discovered in 2013 at



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1 Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, the beetle has spread across 2 Oahu and to the islands of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii. 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a two-year 4 community-based incentive pilot program under the department of 5 land and natural resources to eradicate the coconut rhinoceros 6 beetle in Hawaii. 7 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this Act: 8 "Coconut rhinoceros beetle" means the invasive species in 9 Hawaii that is scientifically known as oryctes rhinoceros. 10 "Community member" includes residents, military personnel, 11 farmers, cultural practitioners, golf course staff, green waste 12 and compost facility workers, retailers, landscape 13 professionals, botanical garden staff, and maintenance 14 personnel. 15 SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the department 16 of land and natural resources a two-year pilot program to 17 incentivize community members to collect and submit to the 18 department the beetle and its larvae. The Hawaii invasive 19 species council shall oversee the pilot program and ensure the 20 participation of stakeholders, including community members.

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(b) The department of land and natural resources shall
 compensate community members for the collection and submission
 of beetles and larvae. The compensation shall be determined by
 the department in consultation with the Hawaii invasive species
 council.

6 SECTION 4. The department of land and natural resources
7 shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations,
8 including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
9 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
10 of 2026.

11 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 14 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 15 year 2026-2027 for a two-year community-based pilot program to 16 eradicate the coconut rhinoceros beetle in Hawaii, including but 17 not limited to:

18 (1) Compensation to community members;

19 (2) Program administration;

20 (3) Community engagement, workshops, and training events;
21 (4) Digital and social media campaigns;

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1	(5) Media advertising; and
2	(6) Educational materials and outreach.
3	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
4	of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
