A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-15.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[{]\$11-15.5[}] Duties of all state agencies; voter
- 4 registration. (a) Each state agency that deals with the public
- 5 shall make available to each member of the public eighteen years
- 6 of age or older an application in the form of an affidavit for
- 7 voter registration pursuant to section 11-15. The application
- 8 shall be available by mail or in person depending on the manner
- 9 in which the agency's services are requested by the person. The
- 10 form of the application may be identical to that described and
- 11 found in public telephone directories.
- 12 (b) Each state agency that deals with the public and
- 13 collects or cross-references reliable personal information
- 14 indicating citizenship status shall provide that an application
- 15 for a license, permit, program, or service shall serve as a
- 16 dual-purpose application. The dual-purpose application shall:
- 17 (1) Serve as an application for voter registration;

1	(2)	Allow an applicant to change the applicant's								
2	registered residence address or name as it appears or									
3		the voter registration rolls; and								
4	(3)	Provide the applicant with an opportunity to								
5		affirmatively decline to register to vote or change								
6		the applicant's registered residence address or name								
7		by providing a check box on the application form								
8		without requiring the applicant to state the reason.								
9	Dual-purpose applications shall not be processed until the									
10	applicant completes the portion of the application related to									
11	voter registration and indicates the applicant's choice of									
12	whether to register to vote.									
13	The submission of the dual-purpose application shall be									
14	deemed to	authorize the director of the respective state agency								
15	to collec	t and transmit the information necessary to register								
16	the applicant as a voter if the applicant made the choice to									
17	register	or to make changes to the applicant's voter								
18	registrat	ion information unless the applicant declined the								
19	changes.	The director of the respective state agency shall								
20	electroni	cally transmit the necessary information to the clerk								
21	of the co	unty in which the applicant resides, election								



1 officials, and the online voter registration system pursuant to 2 subsection (d). 3 The director of the respective state agency shall not 4 transmit any information necessary to register an applicant as a 5 voter if the applicant made a choice not to be registered to 6 vote nor transmit any information necessary to make changes to 7 the applicant's voter registration information if the applicant 8 declined any changes. The director of the respective state 9 agency shall not transmit any information related to a voter 10 application or changes to the applicant's voter registration 11 information if the applicant presents a document demonstrating a 12 lack of United States citizenship. 13 (c) Upon receipt of the completed dual-purpose application 14 transmitted from the director of the respective state agency, 15 the clerk shall review and either approve or reject the voter 16 registration application in accordance with this part; provided 17 that approved voter registration applications received from the 18 director of the respective state agency pursuant to this section 19 shall be treated as having a valid signature for purposes of 20 section 11-15(c), whether transmitted electronically or by 21 facsimile transmission. Upon the clerk's approval of the voter

1 registration application or any changes to the voter 2 registration information, the clerk shall proceed to number the 3 application and register the name of the voter in the general 4 county register as provided in section 11-14 or make approved 5 changes to the voter's existing voter registration information 6 as applicable. 7 (d) Databases maintained or operated by each state agency 8 offering dual-purpose applications containing dual-purpose 9 application information, including any documents or images, 10 shall be accessible and provided electronically to election officials and the online voter registration system to allow for 11 12 the timely processing of voter applications, ensure the 13 integrity of the voter registration polls, and for any other 14 voter registration or election purposes, as determined by the 15 director of the respective state agency offering dual-purpose 16 applications. 17 (e) For the purposes of this section: "Dual-purpose application" means an application, an 18 application for renewal, a change of address form, or a 19
