### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-15.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[f]\$11-15.5[f] Duties of all state agencies; voter
- 4 registration. (a) Each state agency that deals with the public
- 5 shall make available to each member of the public eighteen years
- 6 of age or older an application in the form of an affidavit for
- 7 voter registration pursuant to section 11-15. The application
- 8 shall be available by mail, online, or in person depending on
- ${f 9}$  the manner in which the agency's services are requested by the
- 10 person. The form of the application may be identical to that
- 11 described and found in public telephone directories.
- 12 (b) Subject to compliance with all applicable federal laws
- 13 and regulations, the department of human services shall
- 14 automatically transmit voter registration for any medicaid
- 15 applicant who is of sufficient age to register to vote and has
- 16 been verified as a United States citizen as part of an
- 17 application to the department of human services med-QUEST

7	twenty-one days after the mailing of the notice. If a person
8	returns the notice declining to be registered, the person's
9	registration shall be canceled and the person shall be deemed to
10	have never registered; provided that if the person has voted in
11	an election after the transfer of the person's record but before
12	the notice is returned, the returned form shall be of no force
13	and effect and the person shall be registered as of the date of
14	the person's qualifying transaction with the examiner of
15	drivers.

17	prescribed period, the clerk shall proceed to number the
18	application and register the name of the voter in the general



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#### Report Title:

Voter Registration; Department of Human Services; Med-QUEST; Office of Elections; Examiner of Drivers

#### Description:

Requires the Department of Human Services' Med-QUEST division to automatically transmit applicants' voter registration information to the Office of Elections and clerk of the county of the applicant's residence, subject to certain conditions. Authorizes the Office of Elections to designate state agencies for automatic voter registration if the agency collects, processes, or stores certain information. Updates methods for automatic voter registration conducted by the Examiner of Drivers. Makes conforming amendments. Effective 1/30/2026.
