A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE CONSERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is home to
- 2 a rich diversity of indigenous species of aquatic life,
- 3 wildlife, and land plants that are vital to maintaining
- 4 ecological balance and preserving the cultural heritage of the
- 5 region.
- 6 The legislature further finds that many of these native
- 7 species face significant threats from overexploitation, habitat
- 8 destruction, and climate change, which require immediate and
- 9 enhanced protective measures to ensure their long-term survival.
- 10 The legislature recognizes the 'io, or Hawaiian hawk, as an
- 11 indigenous species of note, serving as a symbol of strength and
- 12 resilience in Hawaiian culture and playing a vital role in
- 13 Hawai'i's unique ecosystem as a native raptor. As an apex
- 14 predator, the 'io helps maintain ecological balance, controlling
- 15 populations of rodents and other invasive species that threaten
- 16 native flora and fauna. However, the 'io faces ongoing threats

- 1 from habitat loss, illegal hunting, and environmental
- 2 degradation.
- 3 The legislature declares that the unauthorized taking and
- 4 killing of indigenous species such as the 'io not only disrupts
- 5 ecological systems but also undermines ongoing conservation
- 6 efforts and risks the loss of irreplaceable biodiversity.
- 7 Therefore, penalties for harming or endangering indigenous
- 8 species, including the 'io, are crucial to deterring these
- 9 harmful actions to restore Hawai'i's fragile ecosystems for
- 10 future generations.
- 11 However, the legislature believes that the current
- 12 penalties for violations involving the 'io do not adequately
- 13 deter harmful activities. Strengthening these penalties,
- 14 including the imposition of significant fines and the
- 15 classification of certain offenses as class C felonies, will
- 16 provide stronger enforcement tools for the State to protect
- 17 these critical species.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 19 (1) Designate the Hawaiian hawk as a protected species
- 20 under penalties for taking and killing indigenous
- 21 species; and

1	(2) Increase penalties and fees for taking and killing
2	indigenous species of aquatic life, wildlife, and land
3	plants that are native to the State.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
6	designated and to read as follows:
7	"§195D- Hawaiian hawk; protected species. The
8	intentional taking, harming, or killing of an 'io, or Hawaiian
9	hawk (buteo solitarius) shall be subject to the penalties under
10	section 195D-9."
11	SECTION 3. Section 195D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended as follows:
13	1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
14	"(a) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this
15	chapter [+]or[+] the provisions of any rule adopted hereunder
16	shall be guilty of [a misdemeanor and shall be punished as
17	follows]:
18	(1) [Fer] A misdemeanor for a first offense by a fine of
19	not less than \$250 or by imprisonment of not more than
20	one year, or both; and

1	(2) [For] A class C felony for a second or subsequent		
2	offense [within five years of a previous conviction by		
3	all and upon conviction shall be subject to one or any		
4	combination of the following:		
5	(A) A fine of not less than [\$500 or by imprisonment]		
6	\$1,000;		
7	(B) Imprisonment of not more than [one year, or		
8	both.] two years; or		
9	(C) Rehabilitative community service."		
10	2. By amending subsections (d) and (e) to read:		
11	"(d) Except as otherwise provided by law, the board or its		
12	authorized representative by proper delegation is authorized to		
13	set, charge, and collect administrative fines or bring legal		
14	action to recover administrative fees and costs as documented by		
15	receipts or affidavit, including attorneys' fees and costs, or		
16	bring legal action to recover administrative fines, fees, and		
17	costs, including attorneys' fees and costs, or payment for		
18	damages or for the cost to correct damages resulting from a		
19	violation of this chapter or any rule adopted thereunder. The		
20	administrative fines shall be as follows:		

1	(1)	For a first violation, a fine of not [more than	
2		\$2,500] less than \$2,500 and not more than \$5,000 or	
3		rehabilitative community service, or both;	
4	(2)	For a second violation [within five years of a	
5		previous violation], a fine of not [more than \$5,000;]	
6		less than \$5,000 and not more than \$10,000 or	
7		rehabilitative community service, or both; and	
8	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation [within five years	
9		of the last violation], a fine of not [more than	
10		\$10,000.] less than \$10,000 and not more than \$20,000	
11		or rehabilitative community service, or both.	
12	(e)	In addition, an administrative fine of up to [\$5,000]	
13	\$10,000 o	r rehabilitative community service, or both, may be	
14	levied fo	r each specimen of wildlife or plant taken, killed,	
15	injured,	or damaged in violation of this chapter or any rule	
16	adopted thereunder."		
17	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
18	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
19	begun bef	ore its effective date.	
20	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
21	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.	

1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
