A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WASTE-TO-ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that using
- waste-to-energy technology is a promising strategy for reducing
- 3 the State's solid waste stream. Waste-to-energy facilities
- 4 divert waste from landfills while extracting energy and valuable
- 5 materials for recycling. Nationally, there are seventy-six
- 6 waste-to-energy facilities that process up to ninety-four
- 7 thousand tons of solid waste per day. This produces enough
- 8 energy each day to power the equivalent of 2,300,000 homes. The
- 9 legislature believes that a waste-to-energy facility would help
- 10 the State meet its goal of reducing the solid waste stream while
- 11 developing sustainable energy sources.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 13 Hawaii state energy office to establish a public-private
- 14 partnership to develop a waste-to-energy generating facility in
- 15 each county having a population below eight hundred thousand.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 196-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
