SENATE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING EACH COUNTY TO ESTABLISH ITS OWN BIOSECURITY PLAN
THAT PRIORITIZES THE NEEDS OF THE COUNTY.

1 WHEREAS, the impacts of invasive species on the State have
2 been severe, harmful, and costly, leading to habitat
3 degradation, extinction of native species, and rising costs in
4 agriculture and livestock production; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the State has recognized the importance of
7 biosecurity as a critical strategy to prevent the introduction
8 and spread of invasive species, which threaten local ecosystems,
9 food security, and public health; and

10
11 WHEREAS, each county faces unique biosecurity challenges
12 due to differences in climate, land use, agriculture, and
13 transportation infrastructure, necessitating localized
14 approaches to biosecurity planning and response; and

15
16 WHEREAS, strengthening biosecurity at the county level will
17 enable proactive identification of risks, enhance early
18 detection and rapid response efforts, and improve coordination
19 with state and federal agencies; and

21 WHEREAS, additionally, establishing county-level
22 biosecurity plans will allow each county to prioritize its
23 biosecurity needs and develop community-based strategies for
24 invasive species mitigation; now, therefore,

26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025,
28 that each county is encouraged to establish its own biosecurity
29 plan that prioritizes the needs of the county; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that because biosecurity efforts are
32 an ongoing effort statewide, each county is encouraged to



1 collaborate with other counties in developing its biosecurity
2 plan; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each county is encouraged to
5 share its findings and biosecurity plan and collaborate with the
6 State, including the Department of Agriculture and Hawaii
7 Invasive Species Council; and


9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this

11 Agriculture; Co-Chairpersons of the Hawaii Invasive Species
12 Council; and Mayors and Council Chairs of the City and County of
