### RELATING TO IMMIGRATION.

EDN/HLT, JHA

Prohibits certain covered educational entities and Hawaii Health Systems Corporation facilities from collecting information regarding citizenship or immigration status or allowing officers of Immigration and Customs Enforcement to enter certain facilities, except under specific circumstances.

HB 330 Status	RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEES. Places oversight of the School Impact Fee Program under the School Facilities Authority Board. Allows the School Facilities Authority Board to dissolve a school impact district without a public hearing.	EDN, HSG, FIN
HB 1188 Status	RELATING TO TEACHER WORKFORCE HOUSING. Establishes a Teacher Workforce Housing Stipend Program to support teacher retention at public and charter schools classified as rural and underserved. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.	EDN, HSG, FIN
HB 624 Status	RELATING TO SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS. Creates a School Psychologists Working Group to recommend actionable steps or propose legislation for an immediate pathway to licensure for school psychologists that can be acted upon in 2026.	EDN, CPC, FIN
HB 625 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes a nationally certified school psychologist incentive program. Appropriates funds for the incentive program.	EDN, CPC, FIN
HB 1314 Status	RELATING TO YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH. Requires that all schools develop plans to execute mental health checkins with their students grades six through twelve.	EDN, HLT, FIN
HB 616 Status	RELATING TO THE SAFETY OF EDUCATIONAL WORKERS. Requires the Department of Education and public charter schools to take certain steps to report incidents of harassment and implement procedures for handling harassment of educational workers.	EDN, JHA, FIN
HB 88 Status	RELATING TO STUDENT ATHLETES. Requires the Department of Education to establish and administer a three-year student athlete travel pilot program to provide funding intracounty travel expenses for student athletes of Maui county. Appropriates funds. Repeals 6/30/28.	EDN, FIN
HB 626 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION.  Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for the Department's Hoʻākea Program.	EDN, FIN
HB 1496 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes the position of Ka Papahana Kaiapuni Program Complex Area Superintendent. Requires that at least one at-large member of the Board of Education be a Hawaiian educator, practitioner, or scholar of Hawaiian studies or the Hawaiian language, to be selected from a list of three nominees submitted by the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Clarifies the purpose and objective of the Hawaiian Language Medium Education Program. Appropriates funds.	EDN, JHA, FIN
HB 471 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the Board of Education to establish a Korean language program. Appropriates funds.	EDN, FIN

Pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement negotiated for Bargaining Unit (5) and subject to the availability of funds, provides annual salary step increases for public school teachers who have completed a year's satisfactory service and comply with specified requirements.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.
