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<u>HB 110</u>	RELATING TO LOCAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.	EDN, AGR, FIN
Status	Modifies certain benchmark goals and timeline for the Department of	

Education to provide locally-sourced agricultural and food products.

HB 328 RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS. EDN, AGR, FIN

Requires the Department of Education to authorize and facilitate complex areas or individual department schools to form their own farm to school meal programs through partnerships to meet the local farm to school meal goal of thirty per cent of food served in the school to consist of locally sourced products by 2030. Allows the Department of Education to establish a plant-based meal program no later than the

2026-2027 school year.

Status

HB 497 Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS. Transfers the Hawaii Child Nutrition Programs Agency from the Department of Education to the Department of Agriculture and codifies its establishment. Establishes a grant program to be administered by the Agency to support the funding of certain initiatives for the State's public schools. Appropriates funds for grants.

HB 245 **Status**

RELATING TO STUDENT HEAT EXPOSURE SAFETY. EDN, HLT, FIN Requires and appropriates funds for the Department of Education, in collaboration with the Department of Health, to develop statewide guidelines related to managing heat exposure to protect students' health during outdoor activities. Appropriates funds for wet-bulb globe temperature thermometers for all public and charter schools statewide.

EDN, AGR, FIN

HB 628 **Status**

RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, PBS, FIN

Authorizes the Department of Education to establish a program to award high school diplomas to persons who did not receive a diploma as a result of compulsory or voluntary induction into the armed services and persons whose high school education was interrupted due to wartime practices during World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War.

HB 841 Status

RELATING TO RETIRED TEACHERS. EDN, LAB, FIN

Requires retirants rehired as teachers or administrators in teacher shortage areas or in difficult-to-fill positions to be paid at least the minimum salary for their experience and qualifications. Prohibits rehired retirants from receiving additional employment benefits. Directs the Department of Education to adopt rules to identify teacher shortage areas and difficult-to-fill positions.

HB 903 **Status**

RELATING TO STUDENT HEALTH. EDN, HLT, FIN

Authorizes a school to maintain a stock supply of bronchodilators to be administered under certain conditions. Authorizes certain employees of a school and department personnel to administer certain medication in emergency situations, under certain conditions. Amends prescription drug labeling requirements to include certain information related to a school, if applicable.

HB 1074 Status

RELATING TO THE USE OF PUBLIC LANDS. EDN, WAL, JHA

Requires the School Facilities Authority to consult with the Department of Education and other impacted departments or agencies prior to the conveyance of ownership rights or lease of lands to the School Facilities Authority.

HB 329 Status

RELATING TO THE SCHOOL FACILITIES AUTHORITY. EDN, JHA, FIN

Clarifies that the School Facilities Authority is responsible for certain development, planning, and construction projects for prekindergarten, preschool, and child care facilities, as well as workforce housing. Allows the School Facilities Authority to use the Department of Education for certain recruitment and hiring responsibilities. Allows the School Facilities Authority to partner with public and private development agencies to develop prekindergarten facilities. Exclude School Facilities Authority Board workgroups and subcommittees from the Sunshine Law, except as it relates to permitted interactions.

<u>HB 323</u> RELATING TO TEACHER HOUSING. EDN, HSG, FIN

Status Establishes the Teacher Housing Assistance Program to provide

housing vouchers to certain eligible teachers. Appropriates funds out

of the Teachers' Housing Revolving Fund.

HB 1088 RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEES. EDN, JHA, FIN

Status Exempts housing developed by the Department of Hawaiian Home

Lands from school impact fees.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
