HB 1344 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN

Status Requires the Department of Education's existing Free Application for

Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) working group to create a state plan to make completion of the FAFSA or an opt-out waiver a statewide graduation requirement by the 2027-2028 school year. Requires a

report to the 2026 legislature.

HB 1499 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. EDN, CPC

Status Expands the Department of Education's authority to allow more trained

staff to volunteer to assist students with the administration of

medication.

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HB 902 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Appropriates funds to the Department of Education to conduct a study on methods to support department schools that may be impacted by the Hawaiian Electric Company's Planned Public Safety Power Shutoff program.	EDN, FIN
HB 961 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes and appropriates funds for a two-year librarian pilot program to serve one school complex on Oahu and one school complex on a neighbor island.	EDN, FIN
HB 962 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the Department of Education to establish and administer a two-year school librarian pilot program to provide funding for qualifying schools to hire librarians. Appropriates funds.	EDN, FIN
HB 730 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes, and appropriates funds for, five full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) positions within the Civil Rights Compliance Branch of the Department of Education.	EDN, FIN
HB 754 Status	RELATING TO COMMUNITY SCHOOLS. Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for community schools and a program manager position.	EDN, FIN
HB 1069 Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Adds two voting members that represent the Department of Education or the Board of Education to the School Facilities Authority Board.	EDN, JHA
HB 636 Status	RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT. Establishes a school capital improvement project modernization initiative in the School Facilities Authority to create a planning database for school facilities. Appropriates funds.	EDN, FIN
HB 987 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Establishes a procurement automation system special fund and aligns section 103D-203(b), HRS, with section 302A-1702, HRS, which added the Executive Director of the School Facilities Authority as a chief procurement officer.	EDN, FIN
HB 901 Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS. Authorizes public charters schools to appeal directly to the Board of Education on matters regarding the schools' operations, governance, or funding, with certain exceptions.	EDN, JHA
HB 904 Status	RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. Repeals the requirement for the Board of Education to annually report to the Legislature, Governor, and the public on public charter schools.	EDN, FIN
