<u>HB 757</u> RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN

Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, requires the Department of Education to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students enrolled

in department schools. Appropriates funds.

HB 1075 RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS. EDN, FIN

Status Amends the law to reduce the amount the Department of Education is

required to charge for school meals to all students enrolled in

department schools.

HB 1500 RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS. EDN, FIN Status Repeals the authority of the Department of Education to set the price for school meals. RELATING TO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION EDN, FIN HB 1293 Status PROCUREMENT. Exempts Department of Education purchases of local edible produce and packaged food products less than a certain amount from the electronic procurement system requirement. Requires at least three written quotes for Department of Education purchases of local edible produce and packaged food products between certain amounts. Requires at least two written quotes for Department of Education purchases of local edible produce and packaged food products between certain amounts for certain schools in rural communities. Sunsets 6/30/2028. HB 333 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Status Beginning with the - school year, requires public elementary, middle, and high school classes to start no earlier than 8:30 a.m. Requires the Department of Education to adjust state-provided bus and school meal schedules accordingly. RELATING TO SCHOOL BUS SERVICES. EDN, FIN HB 288 Status Authorizes the Department of Education to use alternative vehicles for student transportation under certain conditions and appropriates funds for the purchase of alternative vehicles and individuals to obtain CDL licensure. Allows Department schools to initiate staggered start times. Appropriates funds. HB 683 RELATING TO STUDENT TRANSPORTATION. EDN, FIN **Status** Establishes and appropriates funds for student transportation coordinators positions within the Department of Education to strengthen student transportation services across the State. HB 861 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. EDN. FIN Status Designates student transportation as critical infrastructure and a critical service for Hawaii's public education system. Requires all school bus contracts between the State and the contractor to include certain standards, performance metrics, and accountability requirements to prevent service disruptions. RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION SERVICES. HB 862 EDN, FIN Authorizes the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans for school **Status** bus services if certain conditions are met. HB 619 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Status Requires the Board of Education to adopt and enact a policy by the 2026-2027 school year directing Department of Education public schools to incorporate financial literacy education in the school's curriculum. RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB 1343 EDN, JHA **Status** Requires the Board of Education to adopt a policy that bans the use of

phones and related devices by students during school hours.

HB 241, HD1 (HSCR57) Status

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

HSH, EDN, FIN

Establishes a child care classroom contracts pilot program to require the Department of Human Services to contract directly with child care center providers in licensed infant and toddler child care centers and group child care centers that meet certain criteria. Requires reports to the Legislature. Sunsets the pilot program on 6/30/2028. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing.
