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HB 3, HD1 (HSCR295) Status	RELATING TO BEACH MANAGEMENT ON THE NORTH SHORE OF OAHU. Extends the deadline for the University of Hawaii Sea Grant College Program to submit the North Shore Beach Management Plan to the Governor and Legislature. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, HED, FIN
HB 299, HD1 (HSCR643) Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAII INVASIVE SPECIES COUNCIL. Appropriates funds for the Native Resources and Fire Protection Program and Hawai'i Invasive Species Council to ensure their long- term viability and continue to control and eradicate invasive species in the State. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, AGR, FIN



<u>HB 1220, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR302)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES. Appropriates funds to support the efforts of the Division of Aquatic Resources of the Department of Land and Natural Resources in the removal of the majano anemone from Kaneohe Bay. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 175, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR733)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROPERTY MAINTENANCE. Requires owners or lessees of real property to maintain their property and establish penalties for failure to do so. Allows for exceptions. Requires DOA to establish rules for the enforcement and collection of fines for violations relating to the proliferation of invasive species. Requires the Office of the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules for the enforcement and collection of fines for violations relating to the prevention of wildfires and other public safety hazards. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 1278, HD1</u> (HSCR356) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HAZARDOUS TREE REMOVAL. Appropriates funds for the assessment and removal of hazardous trees on state lands across Hawaii. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 867, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR759)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RECREATIONAL FACILITIES. Beginning on 6/30/2030, requires all new playgrounds constructed in state parks and on public school grounds to include accessible recreational playground equipment as part of the recreational apparatuses. Establishes the Accessible Recreational Playground Equipment Special Fund. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, EDN, FIN
<u>HB 1316, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR679)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES. Beginning 1/1/2026, requires rental vessels to be registered and numbered with the Department of Land and Natural Resources before being rented or leased, or offered for rent or lease, by the public for transiting the navigable waters of a state park. Requires registration fees to be deposited into the State Parks Special Fund. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 649, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR361)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SMALL BOAT HARBORS. Establishes the Small Boat Harbor Commercial Vessel Special Fund. Increases moorage fees for commercial vessels. Requires that revenue from the fee increase be used by the Department of Land and Natural Resources for improvements that primarily benefit commercial vessels that utilize state small boat harbors. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds with debt service to be paid from special funds, for repairs of various harbors. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 506, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR301)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONSERVATION ENFORCEMENT. Appropriates funds for equipment for the Oahu Branch of the Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement of the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN



HB 86, HD1 (HSCR355) Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Land and Natural Resources for the establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent Makai Watch Coordinator position. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 1144, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR657)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT IN THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROGRAM. Allows the Department of Land and Natural Resources to employ non- civil service professional and technical staff in its State Historic Preservation Program. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 316, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR306)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE GREEN JOBS YOUTH CORPS. Appropriates funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources to continue the Green Jobs Youth Corps program. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 309, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR294)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FISHPONDS. Establishes a fishpond inventory working group within the University of Hawaii Sea Grant College Program to create an inventory and map of all fishponds on state land and conduct a literature review. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, HED, FIN
<u>HB 29, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR619)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE COUNTIES. Authorizes counties, after adoption of power of sale laws, ordinances, or rules, to sell private property after all notices, orders, and appeal proceedings are exhausted, and to use those revenues to pay unpaid civil fines related to that property. Requires the county to remit any amounts in excess of the unpaid civil fines to the property owner. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 1359, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR718)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FLOOD MITIGATION. Establishes a grant program for drainage system maintenance and flood mitigation measures in residential areas, to be administered by the Board of Land and Natural Resources. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 800, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR594)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. Provides for the transfer of certain parcels in the Liliha Civic Center area and Iwilei Fire Station area from various state agencies to the City and County of Honolulu. Provides for the transfer of the parcel of land on which Alii Place is sited from the City and County of Honolulu to the State. Repeals the sunset provision of Act 4, SLH 2024. Requires the City and County of Honolulu to accept the properties transferred in satisfaction of all amounts owed by Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation under the Kapolei roadways, drainage, and sewer settlement. Exempts the lands transferred to the Department of Land and Natural Resources from the definition of public lands for purposes of chapter 171, HRS. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN



<u>HB 373, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR484)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Repeals the sunset provision in Act 45, SLH 2024, related to the counties' authorization to develop, construct, finance, refinance, or otherwise provide mixed-use developments. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 1007, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR694)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. Authorizes the Hawaii Community Development Authority to cooperate with or assist public and private sector entities to engage in projects that improve the State. Establishes the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement program under the Hawaii Community Development Authority. Repeals the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement district and board. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 818, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR778)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE WAIAKEA COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. Establishes the Waiakea Peninsula Community Development District and the Waiakea Peninsula Community Development District Special Fund. Specifies the powers and duties of the Hawaii Community Development Authority as it relates to the new development district. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 778, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR363)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTEGRATED LAND USE. Requires the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development to conduct an integrated land use study for the use of lands within the agricultural districts and submit interim and final reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, FIN
<u>HB 1494, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR775)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPORTS FACILITIES. Lapses appropriations of general obligation bond funds previously authorized for the planning, design, and construction of a stadium in Halawa by the Stadium Authority. Transfers certain special fund moneys earmarked for the development of a new stadium in Halawa to the general fund. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for a new stadium on the University of Hawaii at Manoa campus. Renames the Stadium Authority as the Halawa Redevelopment Authority and the Stadium Development District as the Halawa Redevelopment District. Amends the powers and duties of the Halawa Redevelopment Authority. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, HED, FIN
<u>HB 1358, HD2</u> (<u>HSCR685)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PUBLIC LAND TRUST WORKING GROUP. Appropriates moneys to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to facilitate the hiring of necessary staff and the purchase of equipment and professional services on behalf of the public land trust working group. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	WAL, JHA, FIN
<u>HB 505, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR661)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RED HILL. Establishes a WAI Policy Coordinator for coordination of Red Hill WAI initiatives. Creates the Red Hill Remediation Special Fund. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	WAL, EEP, FIN



RELATING TO STATE WATER CODE PENALTIES.	
Adds a minimum penalty and maximum penalty per violation of the	
State Water Code and makes each day that a violation exists or	
continues to exist a separate offense. Establishes factors the	
Commission on Water Resource Management must consider when	
determining the amount of the penalty. Increases maximum fines in

five-year increments from 2030 to 2045. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, written submissions will be considered by the committee.
