HB 381 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Increases the procurement thresholds for small purchases.	FIN
HB 988 <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Prohibits a procurement officer from disclosing a competing offeror's proposal or evaluation score, except the summary of scores, during a debriefing requested by a non-selected offeror. Authorizes the disclosure of a competing offeror's proposal or evaluation score after a protest is resolved and the contract is executed.	FIN
HB 1155 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Exempts from the Hawaii Public Procurement Code contracts by government bodies to procure certain construction projects.	FIN



HB 1297 Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Sets time limit for submitting bid protests. Makes 75 day limit for written decision on protest apply to any contract awarded by competitive sealed bid or competitive sealed proposal. Caps the protest bond amount. Deletes the requirement of an administrative hearing office finding that an appeal is frivolous or in bad faith before the protest bond is forfeited to the State by the non-prevailing party.	FIN
<u>HB 1414</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. For procurements conducted by competitive sealed bidding, authorizes the head of a procurement agency to award a contract to a bidder who is not the lowest responsible and responsive bidder if the head of the procuring agency determines that the award is most beneficial to taxpayers or otherwise in the best interests of the State.	FIN
<u>HB 620, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR346)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes state policy to promote braille literacy for eligible blind students. Requires the individualized education programs and section 504 plans of eligible blind students to include the assessment and evaluation of eligible blind students' reading and writing abilities, instruction of braille, and provision of braille instructional materials under certain circumstances. Requires the Department of Education to establish a Braille Literacy Resource Center. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 504, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR669)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP. Amends the transient accommodations tax rate beginning on 1/1/2027. Beginning 1/1/2027, requires a \$20 transient accommodation tax to be levied per night for each furnishing of transient accommodations in exchange for points, miles, or other amounts provided through a membership, loyalty, or rewards program. Appropriates funds to DLNR for protection, management, and restoration of the State's natural resources. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	TOU/WAL, FIN
