AMENDED AGENDA

The following measure(s) has been ADDED to the agenda: HB640, HD1, HB549, HD1

HB 963 RELATING TO CRIMES AGAINST ELDERS. HSH, JHA

Status Establishes strict liability for crimes against elders with respect to the attendant circumstance that the victim was sixty years of age or older.

HB 384 RELATING TO SEXUAL OFFENSES AGAINST MINORS. HSH, JHA

<u>Status</u> Increases the penalty for promoting minor-produced sexual images to a

felony if the person is more than 3 years older than the minor. Extends the probationary term for felony obscenity offenses. Tolls the statute of limitations for obscenity offenses during a victim's minority. Requires sex offender registration for felony obscenity offenses

involving minors.

HB 1100 Status

RELATING TO ACT 253, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2023. Updates the name of the Neighbor Islands Blind and Visually Impaired Service Pilot Program established by Act 253, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, by replacing the term "visually impaired" with the term "low vision" and clarifies the pilot program's implementation timeframes.

Sunsets 6/30/2029.

HB 1283

RELATING TO FAMILY.

HSH, JHA

HSH, FIN

Status

Establishes an exemption from mediation in paternity proceedings where there are allegations of domestic abuse. Clarifies the exemption from mediation in divorce proceedings as it relates to domestic abuse.

HB 689 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO SEXUAL EXPLOITATION.

HSH, JHA

Establishes safe harbor protections for survivors of sexual exploitation

who seek medical or law enforcement assistance.

RELATING TO ORDERS FOR PROTECTION.

HSH, JHA

HB 383 Status

Reinstates mandatory minimum jail sentences for successive violations

of the same order for protection. Removes the distinction between domestic and non-domestic violations of an order for protection. Eliminates the court's ability to suspend mandatory minimum

sentences.

HB 320 Status

RELATING TO SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING

HSH, JHA

AGREEMENTS.

Allows qualified adults, including adults with a disability, mentally ill adults, and adults sixty-five years of age or older, to enter into supported decision-making agreements with one or members of a supportive community. Specifies the terms of a supported decisionmaking agreement, including access to personal information and agreement requirements.

HB 359 Status

RELATING TO COVERED OFFENDER REGISTRATION.

HSH, JHA

Amends covered offender registration laws to include offenders who, while acting in a professional capacity, commit the offense of sexual assault in the fourth degree against a minor who is at least sixteen years old. Provides that the exception to public access requirements does not apply when the covered offense was committed against a

minor.

HB 703 **Status**

RELATING TO KUPUNA HOUSING.

HSH, FIN

Extends the sunset date for the State Rent Supplement Program for

Kupuna to 6/30/2028.

HB 640, HD1 (HSCR199) **Status**

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE.

LMG, HSH, FIN

Requires the Office of the Ombudsman to publish a quarterly report on its website that identifies the number and nature of complaints that it receives regarding the Child Welfare Services Branch of the Department of Human Services. Requires the Child Welfare Services Branch to provide notification that complaints can also be filed with the Office of the Ombudsman. (HD1)

HB 549, HD1 (HSCR149) Status

RELATING TO AN EARLY LEARNING APPRENTICESHIP GRANT PROGRAM.

HED, HSH, FIN

Establishes an Early Learning Apprenticeship Grant Program to be administered by the University of Hawaii to provide financial support for early learning program service providers in the State to participate in state- or federally-approved early learning apprenticeship programs. Requires an annual report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.
