(SSCR943) ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

Status Appropriates funds to the Department of Human Services to improve

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program rates, including establishing additional positions. Effective 7/1/2027. (SD1)

SB 961, SD1 RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION HSH, FIN

(SSCR977) ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

Status Requires the Department of Human Services to adjust the minimum

certification periods for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits households, participate in the Elderly Simplified Application Project, and report to the Legislature. Effective 7/1/2027. (SD1)

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SB 1419, SD1 RELATING TO ACT 253, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2023. HSH, FIN (SSCR947) Updates the name of the Neighbor Islands Blind and Visually Impaired Status Service Pilot Program established by Act 253, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, by replacing the term "visually impaired" with the term "low vision" and clarifies the pilot program's implementation timeframes. Sunsets 6/30/2029. (SD1) RELATING TO CIVIL RIGHTS. HSH, JHA SB 1496, SD1 (SSCR1041) Establishes that it is an unlawful discriminatory practice for places of public accommodation to deny a person with a disability full and equal **Status** enjoyment of information related to their services, facilities, privileges, advantages, or accommodations using information and communication technology intended for use by the general public as applicants, participants, customers, clients, or visitors. Establishes exceptions. Effective 12/31/2050. (SD1) SB 1610, SD2 RELATING TO OHANA ZONES. HSH, FIN (SSCR833) Establishes the Ohana Zones Program as a program within the Statewide Office on Homelessness and Housing Solutions. Authorizes Status the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to exempt ohana zones projects from general excise taxes. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 12/31/2050. Sunsets 6/30/2026. (SD2)

SB 298, SD1 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HSH, FIN

(SSCR938) Appropriates funds to be expended by the Department of Human Status Services to increase funding for Medicaid in-home services. Effective

12/31/2050. (SD1)
