SB 112, SD1	RELATING TO POLICE REPORTS.	PSM. JDC
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(SSCR35) Allows surviving immediate family members of deceased persons for whom law enforcement initiated an investigation to

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criminal proceedings related to the incident. (SD1)

SB 116, SD1 RELATING TO DISCRIMINATION. PSM, JDC

(SSCR36) Establishes provisions relating to civil remedies for discriminatory reporting to a law enforcement officer. Provides that any person who contacts a law enforcement officer to

contact a person on the basis of the person's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, ethnicity, national origin, place of birth, sex, age, religion, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity with the specific intent to infringe upon the person's certain rights shall be civilly liable for resulting damages. Requires the Department of Law Enforcement, in consultation

with the Hawaii Civil Rights Commission, to provide guidance to the public on the enactment of this Act. Effective 7/1/2077.

SB 307, SD1 (SSCR38) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO RECORDINGS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES. Establishes the right of a person to record law enforcement activities. Establishes a private right of action for any violation of the right to record law enforcement activities. Effective 7/1/2077. (SD1)	PSM, JDC
SB 353, SD1 (SSCR37) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. Amends chapter 127A, HRS, to clarify State and local authority. Prohibits the Governor or Mayor from suspending requests for public records or vital specifics during a state of emergency. Adds definition of the term "severe warning". Allows the Legislature and city councils to terminate a state of emergency, in whole or in part, issued by the Governor or Mayor, respectively. Effective 7/1/2077. (SD1)	PSM, JDC
SB 601 (SSCR32) Status & Testimony	RELATED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. Requires law enforcement to post notice that a warranted or warrantless search has been conducted on a property. Requires a law enforcement officer to secure any entrance used by an officer in the search.	PSM, JDC
