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<u>SB 934, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR823)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Budget and Finance for fiscal year 2026 to increase the mass transit special fund expenditure ceiling. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 1526, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR914)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL TOXICOLOGY TESTING LABORATORY. Extends the lapse date for funds appropriated out of the Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory Special Fund for fiscal years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 for the establishment and maintenance of a drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory. (SD2)	TRN, FIN



<u>SB 1195, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR957)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Establishes buffer zones that ban street parking within certain distances of crosswalks under certain posted speed limits. Authorizes the enforcement of prohibited parking regardless of signage or curb markings. Specifies that signs or curb marking shall not be required to restrict parking within twenty feet of a crosswalk or intersection. Designates exemptions. (SD1)	TRN, JHA
<u>SB 1638, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR915)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AIR CARRIERS. Establishes within the Department of Transportation the Molokai Air Carrier Subsidy Program to provide subsidies to airlines operating out of Molokai Airport. Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 106, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR1024)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS. Authorizes pedestrians to act contrary to the statewide traffic code when a reasonably careful pedestrian would determine that there is no immediate danger of a collision with a moving vehicle if the pedestrian is more than 200 feet from a crosswalk. Requires a driver of a vehicle to yield to a pedestrian when the pedestrian clearly indicates their intention to cross a roadway within a crosswalk. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	TRN, JHA
