<u>HB 85</u> RELATING TO THE LAND CONSERVATION FUND. WAL/EEP, FIN

Restores the amount of conveyance tax revenues to be paid into the Land Conservation Fund to ten per cent of conveyance taxes collected

each fiscal year.

HB 742, HD1 RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT.

Requires the Hawaii Community Development Authority to prepare environmental impact statements for the Iwilei/Kapalama and

<u>HB 969, HD1</u> (HSCR101) <u>Status</u> RELATING TO WASTE OR DISPOSAL FACILITIES.

EEP, WAL, JHA

Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of any waste or disposal facility on land that is near or above a significant aquifer as determined by the Department of Health. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 798, HD1 (HSCR103) Status

RELATING TO WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT.

EEP, WAL, JHA

Clarifies the exemptions to the prohibition on discharging any wastewater or raw sewage into state waters after December 31, 2026, including an exemption for treatment plants having a treatment capacity of less than a certain number of gallons per day. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 879, HD1 (HSCR104) Status RELATING TO CESSPOOL CONVERSIONS.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Increases the maximum grant amount for the Cesspool Compliance Pilot Grant Project. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

<u>HB 735, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR162</u>) Status RELATING TO WASTEWATER.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Allows an individual wastewater system to serve up to five bedrooms, regardless of the number of dwelling units or accessory units, whether attached or detached, with certain exclusions. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 511 Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

WAL, JHA

Provides that a survey of the land to be set aside shall not be a condition precedent to the setting aside of public lands to any department or agency of the State.

HB 738, HD1 (HSCR239) Status RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

HSG, WAL, JHA

Creates a process for expediting the review of majority residential mixed-use transit-oriented development, or residential transit-oriented development, on certain parcels within county-designated transit-oriented development zones that have a low risk of affecting historically significant resources. Authorizes lead agencies, including county governments, to make determinations on the potential effects of a project. Creates a ninety-day limit, or thirty-day if no historic property is to be affected, to concur or not concur with project effect determinations. Exempts projects with written concurrence from further review unless there is a change to the project or additional historic properties, aviation artifacts, or burial sites are identified within the project area. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 830, HD1 (HSCR215) Status RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION REVIEWS.

HSG, WAL, FIN

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to contract its review of proposed state projects, projects on privately owned historic property, and projects affecting historic properties to third-party consultants if the Department is unable to complete its review within sixty days. Authorizes the Department to assess the cost of the third-party consultant to the project proponent. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 1008, HD1 (HSCR211) RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION REVIEWS OF STATE AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS.

HSG, WAL, JHA

Status

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to determine the effect of any proposed State affordable housing project within ninety days of a request for determination. Sets forth the historic review requirements based on the project area's known historic, cultural, and archaeological resources. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

<u>HB 734, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR99</u>) Status RELATING TO WASTEWATER SYSTEMS.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Requires the Department of Health, in consultation with various agencies and professionals, to review rules and practices and propose changes that have the potential to make wastewater systems and cesspool upgrades more affordable without compromising water quality. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 379, HD1 (HSCR102) Status

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, WAL, CPC

Requires newly installed or modified individual wastewater systems that are near the shoreline, or likely to pollute groundwater, to include

denitrification capacity. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 1495, HD1 (HSCR229) Status RELATING TO THE KEAUHOU AQUIFER SYSTEM.

EEP, WAL, FIN

Establishes and appropriates funds for the Keauhou Aquifer System Monitoring Pilot Project within the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Appropriates funds for the installation of two monitoring wells in the Keauhou Aquifer System. Requires reports to the

Legislature. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 800 Status RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

WAL, FIN

HB 144 **Status**

RELATING TO MAUNA KEA.

WAL, JHA

Authorizes 2 or more members of the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority to meet during its transition period regarding any matter relating to the Authority's business; provided that no commitment to vote is made or sought and no decision-making action is taken.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.
