The following measure(s) has been ADDED to the agenda: HB1423

HB 743 RELATING TO FISCAL SUSTAINABILITY. WAL, FIN

Requires the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development to develop a model that assesses the fiscal impacts of land use development projects and regional infrastructure investments.

Appropriates funds.

HB 1318, HD1 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. HSG, WAL, FIN

(HSCR222) Removes from the definition of "public lands" lands set aside by the Status Governor to the counties for the purpose of affordable housing. Specifies that lands set aside by the Governor to the counties for

affordable housing require legislative approval for the sale or gift of

such lands. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

Status

HB 1409, HD1 (HSCR137) Status RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT.

Amends the funding priorities of the Rental Housing Revolving Fund to incentivize development in areas that satisfy transit-supportive density requirements. Allocates a minimum percentage of Rental Housing Revolving Fund moneys for certain mixed-income rental housings projects. Requires the Transit-Oriented Development Infrastructure Improvement District Board to consider the infrastructure needs of transit-supportive density requirements. Requires the strategic plan developed by the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development to delineate county-designated transit-oriented development areas for each county. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HSG, WAL, FIN

<u>HB 1410, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR221)</u> Status RELATING TO HOUSING.

Establishes the Supportive Housing Special Fund. Restructures the conveyance tax to a marginal rate system and adjusts the tax for multifamily properties to reflect value on a per-unit basis. Allocates revenues from conveyance tax collections to the Supportive Housing Special Fund. Allocates a portion of conveyance tax collections to the Dwelling Unit Revolving Fund to fund infrastructure programs in county-designated transit-oriented development areas that meet minimum standards of transit-supportive density. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

<u>HB 528, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR204</u>) Status RELATING TO RESIDENTIAL LEASEHOLDS.

Exempts state and county lands leased after July 1, 2025, for an initial period of no less than ninety-nine years from state law governing residential leaseholds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 1359 Status RELATING TO FLOOD MITIGATION.

Establishes a grant program for drainage system maintenance and flood mitigation measures in residential areas, to be administered by the Board of Land and Natural Resources. Appropriates funds.

HB 1087 Status RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION REVIEWS.

Allows the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to assume historic preservation review of the effect of any proposed project for lands under its jurisdiction except for projects affecting properties listed or nominated for inclusion in the Hawaii register of historic places or the national register of historic places.

HB 868 Status RELATING TO DISABILITIES.

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to evaluate its facilities for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and compile a list of non-compliant facilities. Requires report to the Legislature.

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HB 1323, HD1 (HSCR86)

RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF NON-AGRICULTURAL PARK LANDS.

AGR, WAL, JHA

Status

Allows the Department of Land and Natural Resources to transfer certain public lands for agricultural use to the Department of Agriculture without approval from the Board of Land and Natural Resources and Board of Agriculture. Requires the Department of Agriculture, upon approval of the Board of Agriculture, to accept the transfer of and manage certain qualifying non-agricultural park lands.

Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 966, HD1 (HSCR234) Status

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL TOURISM.

AGR/TOU, WAL, JHA

WAL, JHA

Establishes statewide, uniform standards to promote agricultural tourism activities in the State by establishing state agricultural tourism activity requirements that are applicable to all counties that have adopted an agricultural tourism ordinance. Requires agricultural tourism activities to be registered by the county planning department. Requires agricultural tourism activities to coexist with an agricultural activity on a farming operation and requires termination of the agricultural tourism activities upon cessation of the agricultural activity. Makes conforming amendments. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

HB 1423 Status

RELATING TO HANALEI BAY.

Prohibits vessels longer than 75 feet from entering Hanalei Bay.

Exempts vessels operated by a federal, state, or county agency.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.
