Aloha Chair Kapela, Vice-Chair Kong, and Members of the Committee:

I am Brian Miyamoto, Executive Director of the Hawai'i Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,800 farm family members statewide and serves as Hawai'i's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate, and advance the social, economic, and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawai'i Farm Bureau supports HB 957, which designates May 1 of each year as "Laulau Day" in the State. Laulau is an iconic dish in Hawaiian cuisine, deeply tied to both the cultural and agricultural traditions of Hawai'i.

Recognizing Laulau Day not only celebrates the cultural importance of laulau but also highlights the farmers and ranchers who provide the essential ingredients that make this dish possible. Kalo farming has been a foundation of Hawaiian agriculture for generations, with its leaves and corms serving as a staple food source. Traditionally used in cooking, medicine, and cultural practices, Ti leaves remain an important part of local agriculture. Hawai'i's pork industry also contributes to the production of laulau, further supporting local food sustainability.

Establishing Laulau Day provides a valuable opportunity to celebrate the traditions of Native Hawaiian culture and promote greater awareness of the time-honored practices that have been preserved and shared across generations. It also serves as an opportunity to recognize the farmers, ranchers, and food producers who sustain Hawai'i's agricultural industry. Promoting the use of locally grown ingredients in laulau preparation helps strengthen the state's food security, reduces dependence on imports, and supports Hawai'i's farming communities.

We encourage the committee to pass HB 957 to recognize this culturally significant dish while also celebrating and supporting Hawai'i's agricultural industry. Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on this measure.
