The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) supports Senate Bill 1526, which proposes to extend the lapse date for funds appropriated from the Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory Special Fund for fiscal years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 for the establishment and maintenance of a drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory.

This measure is crucial for enhancing the state's capability to conduct timely and accurate drug and alcohol testing, directly impacting law enforcement operations and public safety. Extending the funding timeline until June 30, 2028, ensures adequate time for establishing and implementing the laboratory infrastructure.

The DLE recognizes that a dedicated toxicology testing facility is essential for effective law enforcement operations, particularly in driving under the influence, workplace incidents, and other situations requiring precise toxicology analysis.

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui respectfully submits the following comments in support of S.B. 1526, Relating to The Drug and Alcohol Testing Laboratory. This bill extends the lapse date for funds appropriated for the establishment and maintenance of a drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory.

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui supports this bill because current testing of blood and urine samples in some DUI cases is performed by laboratories located outside of Hawaii. Court cases involving these test results can become extremely costly when the prosecution is required to subpoena experts and lab personnel to testify in court, especially if these witnesses are from laboratories located out of state and require travel and lodging arrangements. Non-Hawai'i witnesses also run the risk of flights being canceled and

weather disturbances preventing travel to hearings.
