"The legislature hereby finds and declares that the practice of acupuncture involves the **examination**, **evaluation**, **diagnosis**, **and treatment of illness** and disability, as well as the strengthening and invigorating of the body. Given its significant impact on public health, safety, and welfare, individuals practicing acupuncture must be recognized as **essential healthcare providers** and therefore be subject to appropriate regulation and control."

Including acupuncturists as essential healthcare practitioners not only reflects the realities of modern healthcare but also ensures that patients continue to receive high-quality, safe, and effective treatment. This measure will also help to integrate acupuncture more fully into the broader healthcare system, facilitating greater collaboration between practitioners of conventional and alternative medicine.
