Chair Tarnas, Vice Chair Poepoe, and members of the Committee:

The Department of Law Enforcement (DLE) supports Senate Bill 401, Senate Draft 2. This bill seeks to include any firearm with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher in the list of prohibited weapons under Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 134-8, with specific exemptions for antique pistols and revolvers, muzzleloaders, and shotguns. The bill also exempts firearms with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher that were legally obtained before January 1, 2026.

The DLE supports this measure as it addresses a significant public safety concern. Fifty caliber firearms are exceptionally powerful weapons originally designed for military applications, capable of penetrating light armor, vehicles, and buildings from significant distances. These weapons pose an outsized risk to public safety, law enforcement personnel, and critical infrastructure when in civilian hands.

**Sylvia Luke** LT Governor Ke Ke'ena The bill takes a measured approach by including grandfather provisions for legally owned fifty caliber firearms obtained prior to the effective date, while preventing the future proliferation of these exceptionally high-powered weapons in our communities. This balanced approach respects existing ownership while addressing future public safety concerns.

The thoughtful exemptions for antique firearms, muzzleloaders, and shotguns demonstrate that this legislation is narrowly tailored to address specifically the most dangerous high-caliber weapons rather than broadly restricting firearm ownership.

The DLE believes this legislation will enhance public safety without unduly burdening lawful gun owners, and is consistent with Hawaii's longstanding commitment to reasonable and effective firearms regulation.

### Subject: Strong Opposition to S.B. 401 – Relating to Firearms

Dear Honorable Senators,

I am writing to voice my resolute opposition to Senate Bill 401 (S.B. 401, S.D. 2), which seeks to prohibit the manufacture, possession, sale, or transfer of firearms capable of firing ammunition of .50 caliber or higher, excluding shotguns, antique pistols, antique revolvers, and muzzleloaders. While I recognize the intent to address public safety concerns, this legislation is an unjustified overreach that infringes on constitutional rights, lacks supporting evidence, and unfairly penalizes law-abiding citizens. I urge you to reject this bill and pursue more effective, rights-respecting solutions.

### 1. Infringement on Constitutional Protections

The Second Amendment of the United States Constitution guarantees the right to keep and bear arms, a right upheld by landmark Supreme Court decisions such as *District of Columbia v*. *Heller* (2008), *McDonald v*. *City of Chicago* (2010), and *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v*. *Bruen* (2022). The *Bruen* ruling mandates that firearm regulations must align with the historical tradition of firearm regulation in the United States. S.B. 401's blanket ban on .50 caliber firearms fails this test, as such firearms have a long history of lawful use for sporting, hunting, and self-defense purposes without widespread restriction. This bill unjustly curtails the rights of Hawaii residents to possess firearms that are in common use and legally owned across the nation.

### 2. Absence of Empirical Justification

There is no compelling evidence that banning firearms capable of firing .50 caliber ammunition will reduce crime or enhance public safety. These firearms, such as the .50 BMG rifle, are rarely used in criminal activity due to their size, cost, and specialized nature. According to FBI

Uniform Crime Reports, rifles of all types—including those chambered in .50 caliber—account for a tiny fraction of gun-related homicides (e.g., 403 out of 13,620 in 2019). Criminals overwhelmingly favor concealable handguns, not large-caliber rifles. S.B. 401 targets a niche category of firearms with no demonstrated link to Hawaii's public safety challenges, rendering it a symbolic gesture rather than a practical solution.

## 3. Arbitrary and Overbroad Classification

The bill's definition of prohibited firearms—"any firearm that is not a shotgun with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher"—is overly broad and poorly conceived. It fails to distinguish between vastly different firearms, such as the .50 BMG rifle (a large, heavy, bolt-action rifle used for long-range shooting) and other .50 caliber firearms with legitimate sporting or historical uses. Excluding shotguns, antique pistols, revolvers, and muzzleloaders while banning all other .50 caliber firearms creates an inconsistent standard that ignores functionality and intent. This arbitrary cutoff punishes law-abiding owners of firearms that pose no unique threat compared to other legal weapons.

### 4. Undue Burden on Law-Abiding Citizens

S.B. 401 effectively criminalizes possession of .50 caliber firearms acquired after January 1, 2026, even with a grandfather clause for pre-existing ownership. This places an unreasonable burden on law-abiding citizens who use these firearms for lawful purposes, such as long-range target shooting, hunting, or collecting. For example, the .50 BMG rifle is a staple in competitive shooting sports, prized for its precision and engineering. Owners of such firearms—often expensive investments—face the prospect of surrendering their property or becoming felons, despite no evidence of misuse. The grandfather clause offers little relief, as it creates enforcement challenges (e.g., proving acquisition dates) and does nothing for future generations of law-abiding enthusiasts.

### 5. Negligible Impact on Self-Defense and Crime

For individuals in rural or remote areas of Hawaii, where law enforcement response times may be delayed, firearms—including those chambered in .50 caliber—can serve as vital tools for self-defense against large animals or other threats. While .50 caliber firearms are not common for this purpose, their outright ban limits options without addressing actual criminal behavior. Criminals intent on violence will not be deterred by this law; they will simply use other weapons or acquire restricted firearms illegally. Meanwhile, law-abiding citizens lose access to tools they may responsibly employ.

### 6. Economic and Cultural Harm

Hawaii's shooting sports community, including hunters and competitive shooters, will suffer under S.B. 401. Firearms like the .50 BMG are celebrated for their engineering and used in national and international competitions. Banning their future acquisition stifles a lawful pastime and harms small businesses—gun shops, ranges, and sporting goods retailers—that rely on

enthusiasts. This legislation erodes a cultural tradition without delivering measurable benefits to public safety.

### **A Call for Practical Alternatives**

If the Legislature seeks to improve safety, it should focus on enforcing existing laws, addressing mental health crises, and targeting illegal firearm trafficking—measures that directly address crime without punishing law-abiding citizens. S.B. 401's focus on a rare and specialized firearm category distracts from these proven strategies and alienates constituents who value their rights.

### Conclusion

S.B. 401 is an unwarranted restriction on constitutional freedoms, unsupported by data, and detrimental to Hawaii's law-abiding residents. I respectfully urge you to vote against this bill and safeguard the rights of your constituents. Let us prioritize solutions that address real threats while respecting liberty and reason.

Thank you for your attention to this critical matter. I am available to discuss my concerns further and would welcome the opportunity to contribute to a balanced dialogue.

My name is Agustin Cabrera and I am a State Legislative Manager with Giffords, the gun violence prevention organization founded by former Congresswoman Gabby Giffords. I write to you today in support of SB401 which would ban firearms or rifles with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher, excluding antique pistols and revolvers, and muzzleloaders.

## Fifty caliber rifles are among the most destructive weapons that may be manufactured and made legally available to civilians in the United States.

Fifty caliber rifles are military firearms, used by armed forces across the globe, that combine long range, accuracy, and massive firepower. A 50 caliber rifle can hit a target accurately from distances of 1,000 to 2,000 yards, depending on the skill of the shooter, and can reach targets at an even longer range, sacrificing accuracy.<sup>1</sup> Designed for use in urban combat situations, 50 caliber rifles can penetrate structures and destroy or disable light armored vehicles, radar dishes, helicopters, stationary, and taxiing airplanes, and other "high-value" military targets.<sup>2</sup>

The destructive power of the 50 caliber rifle can be magnified by the use of certain types of ammunition that are legal under federal law (although banned in some states). In addition to the standard "ball" round of 50 caliber ammunition, armor-piercing, incendiary, and combination armor-piercing and incendiary ammunition for 50 caliber rifles can significantly enhance their destructive capacity.

### 50 caliber rifles can be particularly dangerous when made available on the open market

Despite these firearms' capability for destruction, 50 caliber rifles are generally regulated no differently from other rifles or shotguns and are subject to less regulation than handguns in most states and under federal law.<sup>3</sup> In fact, under federal law and the laws of nearly all states, any 18-year-old who passes a background check can buy a 50 caliber rifle.8 In addition, because federal law and the laws of most states do not require private sellers to conduct background checks, criminals can easily obtain 50 caliber rifles at gun shows and elsewhere.

### Other states have taken steps to increase security regarding the use of 50 caliber weapons

California, Illinois, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia generally ban .50 caliber rifles, while Connecticut bans a single model of .50 caliber rifle. Maryland imposes various regulations on transfers of

50 caliber rifles. Despite the risks inherent in the use of 50 caliber handguns, no state bans 50 caliber handguns as of yet. However, Hawaii can take the opportunity to strengthen their gun violence prevention framework by ensuring they can protect their communities from these strong and dangerous weapons. With the risks so great, we urge the committee to support SB401.

Written Testimony in Opposition to S.B. No. 401, S.D. 2 Submitted to the Senate Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs March 12, 2025

Aloha Members of the Committee,

I write to urge you to vote NO on S.B. No. 401, a bill that seeks to expand the list of prohibited firearms in Hawaii to include any firearm (except shotguns) capable of firing ammunition of .50 caliber or higher, with exemptions for antique pistols, revolvers, muzzleloaders, and pre-existing legally owned firearms. While I respect the intent to enhance public safety, this legislation is misguided, punitive to law-abiding citizens, and likely to yield unintended consequences that undermine both individual rights and community wellbeing. As a proud advocate for liberty, responsibility, and practical governance—values that resonate across party lines—I present the following objections for your consideration.

### 1. Infringement on Second Amendment Rights Disproportionately Harms Law-Abiding Citizens

The Second Amendment guarantees the right to keep and bear arms, a cornerstone of American freedom that protects self-defense and individual sovereignty. S.B. 401's ban on .50 caliber firearms (excluding shotguns) targets a class of weapons that, while powerful, are rarely implicated in crime. According to the <u>FBI's Uniform Crime Reports</u>, rifles of all types—including high-caliber ones—account for only about 3% of firearm homicides annually, with handguns dominating at over 60%. By focusing on a niche category of firearms, this bill punishes responsible owners—hunters, sport shooters, and collectors—without addressing the real drivers of gun violence.

Democrats who value fairness should recognize this as an overreach. In California, a similar <u>ban on .50 BMG</u> <u>rifles</u> enacted in 2004 has not demonstrably reduced crime rates. Instead, it has burdened lawful owners with compliance costs and restricted their rights, while criminals—undeterred by laws—continue using more common, smaller-caliber weapons. Hawaii risks repeating this mistake, alienating citizens who follow the law without improving safety.

### 2. Lack of Evidence Linking .50 Caliber Firearms to Public Safety Threats

Proponents of S.B. 401 may argue that .50 caliber firearms pose a unique danger, but the data tell a different story. These firearms are expensive, heavy, and impractical for criminal use. A <u>RAND Corporation analysis</u> of gun policy effects found no conclusive evidence that banning specific firearm types—like high-caliber rifles—reduces violent crime when broader factors like poverty and mental health are unaddressed. In Hawaii, where gun violence rates are already among the lowest in the nation (1.3 firearm deaths per 100,000 people in 2020, per <u>CDC data</u>), targeting .50 caliber firearms is a solution in search of a problem.

Consider New York's SAFE Act, which broadened restrictions on "assault weapons" and high-capacity magazines. A <u>study by the University at Albany</u> found no significant drop in gun homicides post-2013, suggesting that such measures fail to address root causes. Democrats who prioritize evidence-based policy should demand proof that .50 caliber firearms threaten Hawaii before supporting this bill.

### 3. Economic Harm to Law-Abiding Gun Owners and Businesses

S.B. 401's ban, even with a grandfather clause, devalues legally owned .50 caliber firearms by restricting their transfer, sale, or use outside Hawaii. This imposes a financial penalty on owners—many of whom are

middle-class hunters or enthusiasts—and harms local businesses like gun shops and ranges that cater to this market. In states like Illinois, where Chicago's strict <u>municipal gun laws</u> have limited firearm commerce, small businesses have shuttered, and legal owners have faced property value losses without compensation.

Democrats who champion working families and small businesses should oppose this bill. It risks repeating Illinois' economic fallout, where law-abiding citizens bore the cost of policies that failed to curb violence— Chicago's homicide rate remains among the nation's highest despite stringent laws. Hawaii's legislature should not burden its own people with similar unintended consequences.

### 4. Precedent for Overregulation and Erosion of Personal Responsibility

This bill sets a dangerous precedent for creeping overregulation, targeting firearms based on arbitrary characteristics rather than their use. Today it's .50 caliber; tomorrow it could be any rifle or pistol deemed "too powerful" by subjective standards. Such measures erode personal responsibility—a value Democrats and Republicans alike should defend—by assuming citizens cannot be trusted with certain tools, even when they've proven law-abiding.

Look to Connecticut, where post-Sandy Hook laws like the <u>2013 assault weapons ban</u> sparked widespread noncompliance—over 80% of affected owners refused to register their firearms, per state estimates. This bred resentment and undermined trust in government, an outcome Hawaii can ill afford. Democrats who value community cohesion should reject a bill that risks alienating rather than uniting residents.

### 5. Diversion of Resources from Proven Safety Measures

S.B. 401 diverts legislative focus from strategies that actually reduce gun violence: mental health support, community policing, and targeted enforcement against illegal firearms. In Missouri, relaxed gun laws coincided with a <u>spike in homicides</u>, but the cause was lax enforcement, not legal ownership. Conversely, states like Massachusetts have paired strict laws with robust social programs, achieving low gun death rates without banning specific calibers.

Democrats who advocate for holistic public safety should push for investments in mental health and education—proven to save lives—rather than symbolic bans like S.B. 401. Hawaii's resources are better spent addressing root causes than chasing marginal gains from a .50 caliber prohibition.

### **Conclusion: Vote NO for Freedom, Fairness, and Effectiveness**

S.B. No. 401 is a well-intentioned but flawed measure that infringes on rights, lacks evidence, harms citizens economically, sets a risky precedent, and distracts from real solutions. I urge you—Republicans defending liberty and Democrats seeking fairness and results—to reject this bill. Let's protect Hawaii's people with policies that work, not ones that punish the innocent and paper over deeper issues. Vote NO and send a message that governance should unite, not divide, our state.

SCI Hawaii Chapter Opposes this bill

We respectfully request your time to review the below testimony when considering amendments to SB307.

This testimony is provided through the Hawaii Chapter, Safari Club International, regarding SB 307 as currently proposed. While the amendments would provide a needed remedy in allowing use of large caliber handguns and muzzle loading rifles, as well as shotguns, the currently proposed restriction on large caliber centerfire rifles is too broad and is unwarranted.

If the intent is to ban the use of the .50BMG cartridge, the bill should so state and should not be a broad-based ban on rifles of .50 caliber and larger. The reason is as follows:

The .50BMG cartridge was developed for the Browning machine gun many decades ago. It saw great service in ground-based weapons and in aircraft, though now largely supplanted by more recent systems. As a cartridge for civilian use, it saw almost no popularity until the sport of shooting at silhouette and paper targets at long range became popular. This made the .50BMG cartridge, with its heavy bullet, aerodynamic design (much like the popular .308 and .30-06 in shape) attractive for those wanting to target shoot at long range. This sport is much more popular on the U.S. mainland than in Hawaii, as there are many places where such longer-range target shooting can be safely done.

Several companies, Barrett among the most prominent, began to craft rifles adapted to .50BMG. These are primarily bolt actions, precisely made but long, heavy and not very portable. They are not made for rapid repeated fire, and certainly not for any form of hunting where mobility matters. Given the weight and unwieldiness of the rifles and the high cost of ammunition, this author personally does not see much application for hunting under Hawaii conditions. However, I also see little harm in someone using the cartridge in an appropriate place with all necessary safety precautions, as with any firearm.

The real issue with SB 307 is that applying a broad ban on .50 caliber rifles bans use of many rifles, both new and vintage, which are widely used for hunting. These rifles are available in single shot configuration, as double rifles (usually with the two barrels side by side) and in a few bolt actions. These rifles and the cartridges for them, were developed in response to the need for those hunting or living in areas where large and potentially dangerous game animals are common. That includes much of Africa, the Northern part of Australia, Alaska, Western Canada and formerly included South and Southeast Asia.

If you have read Hemingway or seen "Out of Africa", you will know what I refer to. None of these rifles is in any way suitable for some deranged person to use as a so-called 'assault weapon". They are limited to one, two or three shots in almost all cases. Their heavy recoil and low muzzle speeds, plus the fact that many rifles wear the original open sights, make them unsuited to rapid fire or long-range shooting.

Most of the cartridges were designed in the late 19<sup>th</sup> or early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Many of the rifles themselves, valued and expensive treasures, are over 100 years old, and tell of an era of loving hand craftsmanship. They are valued possessions, intended to be cared for and handed down from generation to generation, accruing memories on the occasions when they are taken to hunt or just to practice on the range. Modern rifles are crafted for this specialized purpose, but they are faithful to the tradition in form and function. They still shoot the same cartridges and still have the same limitations. They are intended for one purpose: to humanely harvest a large and dangerous animal, and to stop a charging beast, at close range. They are by no means suited for human combat or for spraying the landscape with bullets!

Banning such weapons will do nothing to keep Hawaii safer. It will simply deny owners of these magnificent heirlooms the chance to use them and to walk in the footsteps of long-gone professionals in Africa and elsewhere. Those who own these cherished rifles are among those who lead in advocacy for firearms safety and wildlife conservation.

For the record, while this author has indeed hunted in Africa, Alaska and in Australia, and has once had to stop an inbound dangerous animal (while birdwatching in the African bush), I do not write this as an owner of such a rifle. I wish I had one, but do not. However, you can keep such dreams alive for all of us who care deeply about the environment and the wild places. Please amend SB 307 to allow use of these rifles.

A bill like this is proposed over and over again. Below please read the testimony provided by Richard Mays a few years ago. He's a member of the SCI Hawaii Chapter board as am I.

Several companies, Barrett among the most prominent, began to craft rifles adapted to .50BMG. These are primarily bolt actions, precisely made but long, heavy and not very portable. They are not made for rapid repeated fire, and certainly not for any form of hunting where mobility matters. Given the weight and unwieldiness of the rifles and the high cost of ammunition, this author personally does not see much application for hunting under Hawaii conditions. However, I also see little harm in someone using the cartridge in an appropriate place with all necessary safety precautions, as with any firearm.

The real issue with SB 307 is that applying a broad ban on .50 caliber rifles bans use of many rifles, both new and vintage, which are widely used for hunting. These rifles are available in single shot configuration, as double rifles (usually with the two barrels side by side) and in a few bolt actions. These rifles and the cartridges for them, were developed in response to the need for those hunting or living in areas where large and potentially dangerous game animals are common. That includes much of Africa, the Northern part of Australia, Alaska, Western Canada and formerly included South and Southeast Asia.

If you have read Hemingway or seen "Out of Africa", you will know what I refer to. None of these rifles is in any way suitable for some deranged person to use as a so-called 'assault weapon". They are limited to one, two or three shots in almost all cases. Their heavy recoil and low muzzle speeds, plus the fact that many rifles wear the original open sights, make them unsuited to rapid fire or long-range shooting.

Most of the cartridges were designed in the late 19<sup>th</sup> or early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Many of the rifles themselves, valued and expensive treasures, are over 100 years old, and tell of an era of loving hand craftsmanship. They are valued possessions, intended to be cared for and handed down from generation to generation, accruing memories on the occasions when they are taken to hunt or just to

practice on the range. Modern rifles are crafted for this specialized purpose, but they are faithful to the tradition in form and function. They still shoot the same cartridges and still have the same limitations. They are intended for one purpose: to humanely harvest a large and dangerous animal, and to stop a charging beast, at close range. They are by no means suited for human combat or for spraying the landscape with bullets!

Banning such weapons will do nothing to keep Hawaii safer. It will simply deny owners of these magnificent heirlooms the chance to use them and to walk in the footsteps of long-gone professionals in Africa and elsewhere. Those who own these cherished rifles are among those who lead in advocacy for firearms safety and wildlife conservation.

For the record, while this author has indeed hunted in Africa, Alaska and in Australia, and has once had to stop an inbound dangerous animal (while birdwatching in the African bush), I do not write this as an owner of such a rifle. I wish I had one, but do not. However, you can keep such dreams alive for all of us who care deeply about the environment and the wild places. Please amend SB 307 to allow use of these rifles.

I stand in **OPPOSITION** to this bill. This ban on .50 Caliber firearms is attempting to solve a problem that does not exist. We do not have gangs shooting at each other from long distances with .50 caliber rifles. The state has failed to produce any evidence that there is a threat posed by such arms over the past five years since a similar measure had been introduced. It is irresponsible to maintain any attempt to ban a device whereby there is no proven threat vector.

There are many weapons that would fall under this ban, many of them are used for hunting. Including many handgun calibers. While it was stated that this bill would be changed to exclude shotguns, the wording of the law does not match that intent. 12 gauge shotguns, and even flareguns, are capable of firing a certain type of .50 caliber ammunition. Even though it is unwise to do so, these arms can be modified to fire said ammunition in a safer manner through simple means.

The Supreme Court also said in **Caetano** and **Heller** that bans on arms that are in common use for lawful purposes are unconstitutional. Just like tasers cannot be banned, .50 caliber arms cannot be banned and there are FAR more .50 caliber arms legally out there than tasers.

This bill is founded on pure ignorance, for lack of a better word. The author mistakenly believes that all .50 caliber guns are machine guns and can penetrate the armor of a tank from impossible distances or make commercial airliners explode with a single shot and has stated so publicly, and they think the guns can do this simply because the caliber is .50.

This is all simply not true, not only are not all .50 caliber bullets the same, with some being fairly weak pistol rounds to ones coming close but still so far away from the Mythos surrounding the magical '50 cal'.

I would also like to point out that the ban on Teflon coated bullets is a farce. Teflon coating does not make a bullet armor piercing. When Teflon coated bullets were first designed, the designer simply hypothesized that the coating would improve the bullet's 'grip' on certain surfaces like glass or painted metal, and thus allow the bullet to penetrate rather than deflecting off an angled surface like a car windshield.

This hypothesis was later proven false with further testing and even found that the effectiveness of armor penetrating rounds was actually reduced slightly by Teflon coatings. Teflon coatings were still used because they found the coating significantly reduced wear and tear on firearm

barrels during testing and was worth the minor performance reduction. This however has not stopped those who choose to believe the myth from passing and keeping laws like these.

I am writing today to express why I am opposed to SB401. I am writing to educate and encourage this committee to see how unnecessary this bill is for Hawai'i and the United States for that matter. Hawai'i has an extremely low number of crimes committed with firearms. This is thankfully due to the way of life and choices of the people here, far more so than the laws created to hinder certain firearm ownership. Facts should not be ignored when making laws to prevent violent crime. The facts in regards to this bill is that is wholesomely unnecessary and in fact unconstitutional. I will prove my claims later in this testimony and ask you to please do your duty and read this entire testimony and see that this is if fact unconstitutional and should not be passed. The fact that no .50 caliber firearm has been used in a single crime in Hawaii should not be ignored and is something most lawmakers seem to either ignore or are somehow unaware despite thousands of us telling these individuals year after year in testimony, phone calls and emails. Either the law makers completely ignore us or cannot understand reading the English language.

First let's define the .50 caliber firearms being discussed in the bill, specifically those that would be banned. The .50 caliber BMG is used with a rifle platform and is arguably the intention of this bill to ban. The 50 caliber handgun load is used with various modern handguns that are widely in circulation and are commonly owned and would be banned by this bill despite amendments made. Both would be banned by this bill if it becomes law in addition to the acquiring of most all shotguns despite the amendments after it is passed. Neither the .50 BMG nor any .50-caliber handguns are widely used in crimes and that is a fact. In fact, in an attempt to refute a 2004 statement from an NRA spokesperson that "The simple fact is that .50-calibers have not been used in crimes.", the Violence Policy Center lists a long list of criminals and crimes where a .50caliber firearm or round was found, but there were only four cases in the United States, since the early 1990s, where a .50-caliber firearm was actually used to commit a crime. Most importantly, none of those crimes were in Hawai'i. I firmly believe anti-gun lawmakers within Hawai'i work to continue to chip away at rights regarding gun ownership each year. They prove that in any small, even meaningless bill that becomes law, they feel vindicated in their efforts at disarming honest Americans. This disheartens firearms owners and discourages us from speaking out as it is burdensome and time consuming and breaks us all down little by little.

Last year when this bill was being heard (it was not passed then) KHON2 reporters asked Karl Rhoads why the .50 caliber "should be banned if criminals do not often use them," a point not

even lost on the reporter for the station. "Because it's a weapon of war," Rhoads told the channel. "All these gun bills are drawing lines. There's a kitchen knife on this side, and there's a nuclear weapon on this side. So, where is it that you allow civilians to keep having it?" Just so you're aware Mr. Roads, the second amendment was not written strictly for hunting. God forbid our people would have to one day use firearms to protect us from an invading force or a domestic threat but if we did, a disarmed society would be far easier to take control of and an armed population could be a defining factor in remaining a free nation. Recreational range/ sport shooting, plus defense against threats foreign and domestic are integral factors to keeping this nation safe, as clarified within the 2nd amendment. The United States Constitution is very clear and has been even further clarified for all within multiple Supreme Court cases favoring those who hold my beliefs that the second amendment is necessary for this nation. This right is not to be infringed. This is an inalienable right and is not a privilege. This right isn't granted by the government, it is recognized as something granted by God.

As per the Supreme Court Bruen decision, this bill must pass two standards, that I will prove that it fails in both in order to be seen as consistent with the United States Constitution. The first of the two standards is if a firearm is both unusual and dangerous, and the second requirement is if the law matches historical intentions and laws of the land based on the founding father's intentions. The first point of review is that all firearms have some form of danger but they must be scrutinized as whether or not they are unusual and not something seen in the hands of the civilian population. Nuclear bombs would be both dangerous and unusual and would in fact fail the Bruen standards and could be banned from civilian use. The .50 caliber firearm though is something used in this nation widely by citizens throughout the entirety of American history. They are not unusual and are commonly owned by Americans and many of those located in the state of Hawai'i. They are not unusual and dangerous so they fail the first test under the Supreme Court Bruen decision. They are in fact useful for hunting wild boar when a knife and dogs isn't enough for protecting a boar hunter in Hawai'i specifically. I have encountered fully grown wild boar first hand at the ranch I work on and am about to go hunting a herd of 7 wild boars this week in order to keep our ranchers safe and guests that visit our ranch. I doubt many in this committee have ever encountered a wild boar themselves and I'd ask you to think about that for a minute. Would you rather be safe or take away the tools from those that protect others in order to think you are being safer? This tool saves lives and is perfectly useful for that purpose. Anyone who says otherwise is either ignorant or lying. The second point of scrutiny under of this bill would be in regards to historical precedent. This bill does not pass muster there either. This was a common caliber for firearms, hence the addition within this bill to exclude antique .50 caliber firearms. This is a common caliber for a firearm and not something that is not protected by the 2nd amendment and the Hawaii state constitution. This bill is unconstitutional and will fail when brought to the Supreme Court.

This bill will also fail when examined alongside the Colombia v. Heller and Caetano v. Massachusetts cases. In the Heller decision clears up the the 2nd amendment is an individual right, and allows us to protect ourselves not just within our homes but throughout the nation. The arms are protected and necessary for this right to be honored. The Caetano case allowed the carry of a stun gun as it was a arm that was commonly used throughout the nation with over 200,000 in circulation. These firearms being proposed to be banned far outnumber that number and these facts should not be ignored. The fact alone that this bill recognizes that antique firearms must be made an exception from this ban proves that these are common caliber firearms used for centuries in this nation and fully intended to be protected by the 2nd amendment. This body should not be working to tear down the 2nd amendment and should consider legal cases such as these when attempting to take away rights of law abiding Americans citizens.

The costs incurred in tax dollars spent defending an unconstitutional bill could be far better spent on actual firearm education, medical/ mental health care for Hawai'i citizens and even free firearm safety programs throughout all islands that people can attend for free at all ages. A new approach should be considered. Something that addresses the issues and not the tools used. Make our islands safer while not demonizing law abiding citizens and ignoring the actual problems. Please work with us to create firearm training available for those who might have interest. Make it easy and free for citizens and encourage education and stop demonizing law abiding citizens. Talk to judges and prosecutors and get them to actually charge and hold criminals responsible and stop blaming those of us who do not create any issues.

I express my continued opposition to SB 401 SD2 (Relating to Firearms).

# **Irrational Premise**

**SB 401 SD2** continues the same objective of criminalizing ownership of a firearm with no express justification aside from mere conjecture and imagination. The current Senate draft edition presented before you removed the sections articulating an imagined danger posed. Such removal occurred since there is no real danger posed.

# SB 401 SD2 Still Sets a Bad Precedent

The wording in the original **SB 401** draft historically sought to ban lawfully acquired shotguns and would have criminalized shotgun owners with no valid basis. The repeat inclusion of this wording year after year is not accidental. The wording is always included every single time the measure is re-introduced, under a different bill number, of course. **SB 401 SD2** finally corrects this error in its 2025 edition, but the annual re-insertion of language that would have banned shotguns every year prior made me realize something: **SB 401 SD2** is a prototypical legislative platform that will be used to argue that *any* firearm should be banned simply based upon the imagined scenario that *any* firearm may be used by some unspecified threat actor at some unspecified time in the future against some unspecified target.

Passage of **SB 401 SD2** would only enhance calls to ban future lawful acquisition of firearms, whether rifle or pistol. Arguments supporting such future legislation would claim that "dangerous" firearms that can fire .50 caliber rounds were banned in 2025, so why stop there? Why not ban *other* firearms in 2026? If there are no current, real threats posed by current owners of firearms that can accommodate .50 caliber rounds appearing in the news right *now* (at this very moment in time), there will be no such threat *tomorrow*. Such argument of a future threat is purely imaginative.

If there is no clear evidence of a specific threat by a specific threat actor against a specific Hawaiibased target present now, I'll find it highly suspicious that future calls to ban firearms capable of firing .50 caliber rounds in 2026 are backed by "new reports" that are suddenly generated by a partisan legislative agencies or privatized special-interest lobby groups. Speculation of future dangers will always be generated by fear-mongering special interest groups and such speculation will always be the basis for future firearm bans.

# No Current Threat? No Problem.

**SB 401 SD2**, like the original draft, continues to fail the logic test once again in 2025. Without a justifiable threat, there is no justifiable need for a ban other than for the sake of pedantic virtue signaling. If baseless conjecture is still used to justify passage of **SB 401 SD2**, then the conjecture that .50 caliber firearms used in a defensive posture against several heavily-armored criminal actors should still be a sufficient conjecture to counter **SB 401 SD2**.

Aloha Committee Members:

May I please urge you to support this proposed bill because as previous legislative testimony states, while Hawai'i has stringent gun safety laws in place, an omission exists in the existing statute prohibiting the use of certain very dangerous weapons. Firearms or rifles with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher are not currently included in the list of prohibited firearms, which is contradictory to the State's position on gun safety.

According to the Department of Law Enforcement in its testimony provided at a public hearing held on this measure, fifty caliber firearms are capable of penetrating buildings, vehicles, and protective equipment, making them particularly dangerous when used in criminal activities or acts of violence and put both our public safety officers as well as the general public at great risk.

This bill addresses this gap in the law by prohibiting firearms or rifles with the capacity to fire ammunition of fifty caliber or higher, which is a grade of firearm lacking an essential public use justifying the continued permission of this type of weapon under state law. Appropriate exemptions have been included that exclude antique pistols and revolvers, and muzzleloaders, in the list of prohibited weapons.

Thank you for continuing to do all that's possible to protect public safety with stringent gun safety legislation in Hawai'i.

I am submitting this testimony in fierce opposition to Senate Bill 401, a reckless and unconstitutional attack on law-abiding gun owners. This bill does absolutely nothing to stop violent crime, but it does criminalize honest citizens who have followed every law and regulation placed upon them. It is yet another misguided attempt to erode Second Amendment rights under the false pretense of public safety.

The Data Proves This Bill Is Useless

According to FBI crime statistics, between 2010 and 2020, there were zero homicides involving a .50 caliber rifle in the entire United States. Zero.

The 12-gauge shotgun, which exceeds the .50 caliber threshold, is one of the most commonly owned firearms in America, yet shotguns of all types were used in only 264 homicides in 2019, compared to 6,368 with handguns (FBI UCR 2019).

The idea that banning these firearms will reduce crime is not just wrong—it's a deliberate misrepresentation of reality.

Hawaii Already Has Some of the Strictest Gun Laws in the Nation

Hawaii's gun laws are already among the most restrictive in the country. Every firearm is registered, every purchase requires a permit, and background checks are already mandatory.

Criminals do not follow these laws. More bans will only hurt the people who do.

Instead of wasting time on useless restrictions, lawmakers should focus on enforcing existing laws and targeting actual criminals.

### Conclusion

SB 401 is nothing but an attack on law-abiding citizens under the false pretense of public safety.

### Aloha,

I am providing written testimony in **opposition** to SB401.

SB401 will ban commonly owned shotguns (larger than .50 caliber) and do nothing but instantly criminalize law-abiding firearms owners. There is no grandfather clause and thus, anyone who owns shotguns, incredibly common firearms, will be turned into felons overnight. Despite constantly educating lawmakers on this major flaw there seems to be an insistence on forcing a ban through.

Moreover, the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS), through the NYSRPA vs. Bruen decision (2022), recently established "text, history, and tradition" as the new standard for jurisprudence regarding the Second Amendment. SB401 provides no historical analogs to justify its consideration. Reaching further back, the SCOTUS decision in District of Columbia vs. Heller (2008) noted that arms in common use for lawful purposes cannot be banned. Shotguns are considered arms, by definition, and thus a ban on them is, by and large, an arms ban. My name is Dennis Dunn, and I am the retired Director of the Victim Witness Kokua Services in the Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney's Office after 44 years of service. Prior to that I was a volunteer Victim Advocate for People Against Rape. I am testifying today **in strong support of SB 401**, **S.D. 2**.

Too often during my career in victim assistance I had to console victims of gun violence or their surviving family members. We hardly need to be reminded of the immense destructive power of assault weapons as we are constantly made aware of the death and suffering cause by them in the virtual daily litany of mass casualty incidents that are caused by these weapons. There is no legitimate purpose in a civilized society for devices whose only purpose is to rapidly administer death and serious bodily injury to human beings. I am uncertain as to why our current firearms statutes fail to outlaw to encompass the type of excessive firearms covered in this bill, but the time to change that is now. Given the increases in gun crimes, even in Hawai'i, this is a critical legislative need. Our statutory defense against assault weapons must be airtight with no loopholes. The stakes in the battle against gun violence are high and we must marshal every resource in preventing the use and ownership of assault weapons anywhere in Hawai'i.

## **1. Second Amendment Protections**

The Second Amendment guarantees the right to bear arms, a principle central to American liberty. Banning .50 caliber rifles—a category of firearms rarely misused—sets a dangerous precedent for eroding lawful gun ownership. Broad prohibitions targeting specific firearms undermine the constitutional rights of responsible citizens who use these weapons for legal purposes, such as sport shooting or collection.

# 2. Legitimate Uses Outweigh Rare Misuse

.50 caliber rifles are niche firearms with specialized applications:

- **Long-Range Sport Shooting**: Enthusiasts use these high-precision rifles in competitive matches, often at distances exceeding 1,000 yards.
- **Collecting**: Many owners value them as historical artifacts (e.g., WWII-era anti-materiel rifles) or engineering marvels.
- **Rural and Hunting Use**: In some regions, they are employed for hunting large game or predator control.

Their size, cost (\$3,000+), and lack of concealability make them impractical for criminal use. FBI crime data consistently shows negligible involvement of .50 caliber rifles in violent crimes, highlighting the disconnect between their perceived threat and reality.

# **3. Ineffective Policy**

A ban would fail to address root causes of violence while penalizing lawful owners. Criminals inclined to misuse firearms typically resort to handguns or illegally modified weapons, not cumbersome, highly regulated rifles. For example, in 2022, handguns accounted for over 80% of firearm homicides (CDC data), whereas .50 caliber rifles are statistically irrelevant in such cases. Targeting rarely misused tools distracts from evidence-based solutions like mental health support or targeted enforcement.

# 4. Enforcement Challenges

Confiscating or regulating existing .50 caliber rifles would strain law enforcement resources and risk overreach. Historically, firearm bans (e.g., 1994 Assault Weapons Ban) proved difficult to enforce and had little impact on crime rates. Meanwhile, such measures risk fostering black markets or incentivizing criminals to adapt, rather than deterring violence.

# 5. Slippery Slope

Banning firearms based on caliber or aesthetics opens the door to incremental erosion of gun rights. If policymakers can prohibit .50 caliber rifles today, what stops future bans on other legally owned firearms? This approach prioritizes symbolic politics over practical safety, undermining trust in governance.

# 6. Existing Laws Are Sufficient

Federal regulations already govern .50 caliber rifles:

- Buyers undergo rigorous background checks.
- Anti-materiel variants are regulated under the National Firearms Act (NFA), requiring extensive paperwork and fees. Strengthening enforcement of current laws—rather than imposing new bans—would more effectively promote public safety without infringing on rights.

## Conclusion

A .50 caliber ban is a misplaced solution that infringes on constitutional freedoms, harms responsible owners, and ignores empirical evidence. Policymakers should focus on addressing socioeconomic drivers of violence and enforcing existing laws, rather than enacting ineffective prohibitions. Protecting lawful gun ownership while targeting criminal behavior ensures a balanced approach to public safety and civil liberties.

Although I deplore the rise of gun-related violence in Hawaii, and gun violence is an epidemic in our country, this legislation targets a category of firearms that have a relatively low association with murders or the crimes we've seen in the news. Far more dangerous and common firearms would be .223 cal high-velocity assault rifles or assault pistols (large magazine-equipped machine pistols) which have been used in numerous school and other mass shootings, sa well as drug-related violence. Where is the legislation prohibiting those?

Though .50 caliber arms are impractical for hunting, close quarters home defense or sporting, those same characteristics make them impractical for most crimes and murders of passion, even pre-meditated. They're expensive, the ammunition is expensive and they're large and heavy.

I am concerned about arms of this kind being *only* in police and military hands in this political climate.

There are a few anecdotes of an occasional crimed being committed with a .50 cal arm, but far, far fewer than handguns and assault rifles.

I feel this legislation is "taking aim" at a class of firearm that has little actual crime-association (multiple reports from various organizations back to 1999 mostly report they're *found* among the hoards of criminals who actually used smaller caliber arms in the commission of their crimes), for a relatively wasy "win", without actually addressing the guns that are used in crimes, or tracking those who shouldn't have guns at all, such as known felons.

- Fails Supreme Court Tests: Under the Bruen decision, a firearm ban must prove that the weapon is both "dangerous and unusual" and consistent with historical firearm regulations. The argument asserts that .50 caliber firearms are:
  - Not unusual, as they have been commonly owned and used throughout U.S. history.
  - Not uniquely dangerous, as all firearms pose potential risks, but .50 caliber weapons have not been used in crimes in Hawai'i.
- Heller and Caetano Precedents:
  - Heller affirmed that the Second Amendment protects an individual's right to possess firearms for self-defense, not just for hunting.
  - Caetano ruled that weapons in common use (such as stun guns) are protected under the Second Amendment, and .50 caliber firearms far outnumber the 200,000 stun guns cited in that case.

• Logical Inconsistency in the Bill: The bill exempts antique .50 caliber firearms, indirectly admitting that these weapons have been historically used and widely accepted, contradicting the argument that they are "unusual."

Personal and Specific Negative Effects of SB401

- Disruption of Work and Personal Safety: My son works on a ranch and actively hunts wild boar for safety reasons. .50 caliber firearms are essential tools in hunting and protecting ranchers and guests. Removing access to these firearms directly jeopardizes their ability to do their job and stay safe.
- Financial and Emotional Burden: Continuous gun restrictions in Hawai'i dishearten and discourage law-abiding citizens who must repeatedly fight against legislation that aims to chip away at their rights.
- Undermines Law-Abiding Gun Owners: The law targets responsible firearm owners, not criminals. The repeated push for such laws is frustrating and demoralizing, making citizens feel ignored and under attack.
- Wasted Taxpayer Money: The bill is likely to be challenged in court and overturned, wasting millions of taxpayer dollars in legal battles. These funds would be better spent on mental health services, firearm safety education, and crime prevention programs.

Practical and Logical Counterarguments

- Lack of Criminal Use:
  - There are no documented cases of .50 caliber firearms being used in crimes in Hawai'i.
  - Nationwide, only four cases since the early 1990s involved a .50 caliber firearm being used in a crime.
- No Public Safety Benefit: The ban does not address crime, suicides, or mass shootings, making it a symbolic restriction rather than a practical solution.
- Defensive and Sporting Use:
  - .50 caliber firearms are commonly used for hunting, sport shooting, and defense.
  - They serve legitimate and lawful purposes, including ranch security and protection against dangerous wildlife.
- Failure to Address the Root Causes of Violence:
  - Instead of banning firearm ownership, lawmakers should focus on enforcing existing laws against criminals.
  - The government should invest in education and safety programs instead of criminalizing law-abiding citizens.

## Conclusion

Sec. 2. Plan of Action. (a) Within 30 days of the date of this order, the Attorney General shall examine all orders, regulations, guidance, plans, international agreements, and other actions of executive departments and agencies (agencies) to assess any ongoing infringements of the Second Amendment rights of our citizens, and present a proposed plan of action to the President, through the Domestic Policy Advisor, to protect the Second Amendment rights of all Americans.

(b) In developing such proposed plan of action, the Attorney General shall review, at a minimum:

(i) All Presidential and agencies' actions from January 2021 through January 2025 that purport to promote safety but may have impinged on the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens;

(ii) Rules promulgated by the Department of Justice, including by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, from January 2021 through January 2025 pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;

(iii) Agencies' plans, orders, and actions regarding the so-called "enhanced regulatory enforcement policy" pertaining to firearms and/or Federal firearms licensees;

(iv) Reports and related documents issued by the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention;

(v) The positions taken by the United States in any and all ongoing and potential litigation that affects or could affect the ability of Americans to exercise their Second Amendment rights;

(vi) Agencies' classifications of firearms and ammunition; and

(vii) The processing of applications to make, manufacture, transfer, or export firearms.

Sec. 3. Implementation. Upon submission of the proposed plan of action described in section 2 of this order, the Attorney General shall work with the Domestic Policy Advisor to finalize the plan of action and establish a process for implementation.

Sec. 4. General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

(i) the authority granted by law to an executive department, agency, or the head thereof; or

(ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.

(b) This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.

(c) This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

President Trumps Executive Order simply states that Firearms have been used since the founding of our great Republic for the protection of ourselves, our families and our freedom, and is the foundation for all the other rights we as American hold dear, the rights of the people must not be infringed.

Self-defense is a fundamental right recognized by the Constitution, yet legislation such as Hawaii's SB 401 threatens to undermine that right by restricting access to firearms capable of firing fifty caliber or higher ammunition. While these firearms are often associated with specialized uses, some individuals rely on them for personal defense, particularly in rural areas where law enforcement response times can be prolonged and encounters with large predators are possible. By limiting access to these firearms, SB 401 not only hinders the ability of law-abiding citizens to protect themselves but also creates a dangerous disparity of force, as criminals—who do not abide by gun laws—remain unaffected by such restrictions.

One of the primary concerns with restricting access to high-caliber firearms is the varying availability of law enforcement in emergency situations. While urban areas may benefit from relatively quick police response times, those living in rural or remote locations often face significant delays in receiving assistance. In situations where seconds matter, individuals must be able to defend themselves effectively rather than waiting for help that may not arrive in time. Prohibiting access to powerful defensive tools leaves citizens vulnerable, forcing them to rely on less effective means of protection. For those facing threats from large predators, aggressive intruders, or multiple assailants, a firearm with sufficient stopping power can mean the difference between life and death.

Furthermore, criminals, by definition, do not abide by firearm laws. Those intent on causing harm will obtain weapons through illegal means, regardless of restrictions placed on law-abiding citizens. This reality creates a dangerous imbalance: law-abiding individuals are stripped of effective self-defense options, while criminals remain fully armed and emboldened by the knowledge that their victims are likely defenseless. This disparity of force puts innocent people at a severe disadvantage, making them easier targets for violent crime.

Self-defense is a fundamental right because law enforcement cannot always be present in acute or life-threatening situations. Police response times vary, and in many cases, officers arrive only after a crime has occurred. This is especially true in rural areas or during large-scale emergencies when law enforcement resources are stretched thin. Citizens are their own first line of defense, and limiting magazine capacity hampers their ability to effectively protect themselves and their families.

Ultimately, SB 401 and similar legislation fail to address the root causes of violence while simultaneously infringing upon the rights of responsible gun owners. Rather than enhancing public safety, such restrictions embolden criminals and leave citizens more vulnerable in critical

situations. The ability to effectively defend oneself is a cornerstone of personal freedom, and laws that erode that right only serve to endanger those who choose to follow them.

The gun laws that infringe upon constitutional rights are frequently contested in courts. The outcomes of such challenges can vary, with some laws being upheld and others struck down. Therefore, it is plausible that similar legislation, such as Hawaii's SB 401, could face legal challenges on constitutional grounds.

Also,

In situations where an imminent threat arises, especially one that unfolds rapidly, there may be no time to call 911, let alone wait for law enforcement to arrive. For many individuals— especially women—a firearm serves as the most effective equalizer in a life-threatening situation.

The unfortunate reality is that criminals often target those they perceive as vulnerable. Women are more likely to face violent encounters where physical strength disparities put them at a disadvantage. In such cases, relying solely on unarmed self-defense techniques or waiting for help can be a fatal mistake. A firearm allows someone facing a superior threat—whether it be a larger, stronger attacker or multiple assailants—to defend themselves effectively.

Anti-gun laws that restrict access to necessary defensive tools disproportionately harm those who are most vulnerable. While criminals will always find ways to obtain weapons illegally, law-abiding citizens—who follow the law and seek to protect themselves—are the ones left defenseless by these restrictions.

At the end of the day, your right to self-defense is fundamental. A firearm is often the only viable tool that allows you to stand a chance in an immediate, violent encounter. No one should have to rely solely on the hope that law enforcement arrives in time when seconds determine survival.

Good afternoon Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and Committee Members. My name is Ian Barnes, I've been a resident of Maui county for the past 15 years. I'm a first responder, father, and avid hunter. I am testifying against SB401.

First of all this bill is in clear violation of the second amendment of the united states constitution. It directly infringes on law abiding citizens' rights to own common firearms that are already legally owned by thousands of law abiding people here in the state. By passing this bill the Hawaii legislature is complicit with criminalizing most of those law-abiding citizens for exercising a God-given right. This bill also goes against the supreme court ruling Caetano v. Massachusett, where the court reiterated that the second amendment applies to the state and extends to "bearable arms" that "were not in existence at the time of the founding".

The argument for the necessity of SB401 is unfounded when considering that Hawaii has a homicide rate of only 2.7 per 100,000. In fact, this low homicide rate is precisely thanks to the availability of firearms to law-abiding citizens. These restrictions on gun ownership and transfers are simply not warranted. More restrictive gun laws that target, largely, law abiding citizens are not going to keep criminals from obtaining weapons and is not going to keep them from committing crimes. Criminals don't follow the laws, law abiding citizens do. More gun restrictions such as these only leave the average law abiding citizen more defenseless when the criminals come around with their illegal weapons.

This bill also will directly affect law abiding hunters. Many weapons that hunters use today to harvest meat for their family or other families are going to no longer be legal. Whether it's because of the type of weapon or an attachment that they use on their weapon. This is not fair to the citizens that are following all the laws and simply just trying to provide for their families. Again these prohibitions are not necessary, they are just taking away from citizens that are following the laws and helping to manage the wild game on the islands.

SB401 relies on sensationalism instead of science. The use of the descriptions "assault rifle" and "high capacity" is disingenuous. Assault is an action. An object cannot assault on its own. "High Capacity" is an ambiguous term used for any magazine over 10 rounds in capacity. There are many firearms that were originally designed to hold more than 10 rounds. It criminalizes parts or accessories that appear "scary" cosmetically. Bills like these are pushed by politicians that have

no real knowledge of firearms and no real evidence to support it. They are playing off the fear of the public to benefit their approval rating and agendas.

Effective crime prevention requires targeting criminal behavior, not inanimate objects.

This ban would set a dangerous precedent for overregulation. Caliber restrictions could easily expand to include other commonly owned ammunition, eroding rights incrementally. Additionally, such bans would devastate local businesses, from firearm manufacturers to sporting goods stores, and harm competitive shooting sports that contribute to tourism and community engagement.

Instead of targeting lawful gun owners, I urge you to prioritize policies that address the root causes of violence:

- Strengthening penalties for illegal firearm possession and use.
- Improving mental health resources and early intervention programs.

While I applaud that SB401 has been predictably amended to avoid banning shotguns, it still makes zero sense and is capriciously designed to do nothing more than be punitive to law-abiding firearms enthusiasts and salami slice away rights to self-defense.

Practically speaking, what is Hawaii's legal definition of "shotgun"? How are 729 caliber (12 gauge) or 615 caliber (20 gauge) rifled barrels going to be classified? It is common for these barrels to be installed in place of smoothbore shotgun barrels, and their use for hunting with slugs should be encouraged, due to their limited maximum ranges. What in Hawaii's law is going to separate a 615 caliber centerfire firearm shooting a single projectile from a 50 caliber centerfire firearm shooting a single projectile? **If these considerations are going to be dependent on Federal law anyways, why not simply continue deferring to Federal law on this issue?** As it stands, this bill's language would still require judicial clarification; simply inserting "not a shotgun" does not clear legislation make.

**50** caliber firearms are empirically among the safest guns there are. 50 BMG firearms are the most-often targeted by legislation despite being simply too heavy, too expensive, and too powerful for common criminal use. SB401 would also ban other much less powerful 50 caliber cartridges like 50 Beowulf, 500 S&W, and 50 AE, which are uncommon and specialized cartridges (they have practical uses for hunting around bears) that are also less practical for crime than many other commonly available cartridges, and also do very little ballistically that other cartridges don't.

50 caliber cartridges are as common as they are due to nearly 100-year-old Federal law that places additional restrictions on calibers over half an inch. 50 has been the limit, and the firearms industry has innovated within that legal limit. Hawaii lowering our legal limit from "can't be over 50 caliber" to "must be under 50 caliber" *only affects firearms that are exactly 50 caliber*. This is a petty and punitive attack on the law-abiding. There is no technical reason somebody couldn't bore a new barrel to 49 caliber, and resize brass to 49 caliber, and turn bullets down to 49 caliber, and be left with a 49 caliber firearm that does exactly what a 50 caliber firearm does. So what is this bill seeking to accomplish? **In no plausible way can this bill positively impact crime statistics.** 

I own a 50 caliber rifle. Shooting it is roughly the firearms equivalent of racing a purpose-built dragster. I invite any lawmaker to handle and shoot it, to gain firsthand experience on its impracticality for criminal enterprise. **Banning 50 caliber firearms to prevent crime is like banning Top Fuel dragsters in order to prevent street racing and slow down getaway drivers.**

Chairman Tarnas and members of the House Committee on JHA:

I am testifying OPPOSING S.B. 401 SD2

This bill seeks to make transfer or possession of firearms with a caliber of .50 or greater illegal in the future. It appears to be aimed at firearms intended to fire the .50 BMG cartridge. I am unaware of any crime occurring in Hawaii where a rifle chambered for this cartridge was involved. The harm is entirely speculative.

There are many avenues to reduce the incidence of crime in our state. Prohibiting rifles chambered for .50 or larger is not a priority.

I note that under federal law (National Firearms Act of 1934 recodified as Title II Gun Control Act of 1968) a "destructive device" is defined as (in part):

"(2) any type of weapon by whatever name known which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, the barrel or barrels of which have a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter, except a shotgun or shotgun shell which the Secretary finds is generally recognized as particularly suitable for sporting purposes; and (3) any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting any device into a destructive device as defined in subparagraphs (1) and (2) and from which a destructive device may be readily assembled." [26USC5845(f)]

Firearms that meet the definition of "destructive device" require registration, making, and transfer taxes and are unlikely to be used in crime.

Further, the Act defines "antique firearm":

"(g) Antique firearm. The term 'antique firearm' means any firearm not designed or redesigned for using rim fire or conventional center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in or before 1898 (including any matchlock, flintlock, percussion cap, or similar type of ignition system or replica thereof, whether actually manufactured before or after the year 1898) and also any firearm using fixed ammunition manufactured in or before 1898, for which ammunition is no longer manufactured in the United States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels of commercial trade." [26USC5845(g)]

26USC5845(f) provides an exemption from destructive device determination "The term 'destructive device' shall not include ... any other device which the Secretary finds is not likely to be used as a weapon, or is an antique or is a rifle which the owner intends to use solely for sporting purposes."

Federal law is sufficient for this case and Hawaii law should conform to the definitions of destructive device and antique firearm.

How often are .50 caliber firearms used in crimes here? Almost never—Hawaii's gun violence stems overwhelmingly from handguns, not these rare, specialized weapons. National data backs this: the FBI's 2022 crime stats show rifles of any kind, let alone .50 caliber, account for less than 3% of firearm homicides. In a state with our low crime rates and strict laws, this feels like theater, not safety.

For folks like me—hunters, collectors, or those who value self-defense—this bill strips away rights without evidence. These firearms aren't cheap or common; they're owned by people who've jumped through Hawaii's hoops: permits, checks, registration. Yet SB 401 punishes us, not criminals who bypass laws anyway.
