TESTIMONY ON SB 506

Relating to Agriculture

Aloha Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Richards and Members of the Committee,

I am Benson Medina, Director of the Department of Research and Development, County of Hawai'i. One of the agricultural objectives of this department is to "support research, development, control, and education that improves agricultural production, quality, resilience, and producer viability or reduces the impact of pests or disease on agricultural crops, livestock, forests, or the community."

The County of Hawai'i provides written testimony in **SUPPORT of SB506**, to conduct a study of agricultural markets for Hawai'i farmers and to establish positions in the Department of Agriculture to collect relevant agricultural data for public consumption.

Access to comprehensive agricultural statistics and market data would have a significant positive impact on Hawai'i's agriculture industry. The 2021 Hawai'i County Agriculture and Food Systems Study identified the need for increased market research and value chain analysis to better understand consumer demand and guide marketing efforts for producers in Hawai'i County. Stakeholders expressed frustration over the lack of available data on market demand, which makes it difficult for farmers to plan production. At the same time, without accurate and timely data, State and County agencies are unable to track statewide progress towards key local food systems goals.

Ultimately, this initiative strengthens the economic stability of Hawai'i's agricultural sector by equipping producers with actionable data to optimize their business strategies. Additionally, SB506 provides State and County policymakers and decision-makers with information needed to track statewide goals and direct public resources to benefit the agricultural sector and the public. This increased efficiency helps ensure that agriculture remains a reliable source of income; SB506 supports both the agricultural community and the broader economic well-being of Hawai'i.

Thank you for championing agriculture in Hawai'i and for the opportunity to provide testimony in **SUPPORT** of SB506.

The Hawai i Farm Bureau supports SB 506, which requires the Department of Agriculture to conduct a study on agricultural markets for Hawai i farmers, appropriates funds for the one year study on agricultural markets for Hawai i farmers, and establishes and funds two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions to collect agricultural data and conduct data analysis for public consumption.

Hawai'i's farmers and ranchers face unique challenges, including high production costs, limited market access, and competition from imported goods.
