Position:

The Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") supports this measure and offers the following comments for consideration.

Comments:

The Commission appreciates the intent of this resolution to streamline state and intergovernmental permit processes by convening a task force for permit simplification.

In our regulatory oversight of public utilities, the Commission has heard firsthand how slow and/or convoluted permitting processes can negatively impact developers. In some cases, permit time alone can obstruct otherwise viable projects. The Commission is willing and able to commit time to attending and participating in this task force as outlined in the bill.

Particularly as it pertains to clean energy, the Commission would also suggest looking into how other states have addressed permit simplifications, such as in Massachusetts.¹ Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure.

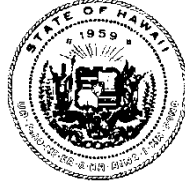
The Land Use Commission ("LUC") has been identified to participate and be represented on the task force. Representatives on the task force have been asked to be designated no later than August 1, 2025.

The permitting process is often time-consuming due to the understaffing of resource-constrained agencies, the complexity and multiplicity of requirements, the sequential and contingent nature of reviews, and the potential for legal challenges, among other things. The entitlement and permitting process can take over five years, creating significant delays and uncertainty for housing projects, increasing carrying costs and capital market risks, and deterring investment in affordable housing.

HHFDC is named as a member of the task force and supports efforts to streamline the permitting process across various government agencies.
