A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOBBYIST CONTRIBUTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act clarifies administrative oversight of
 statutory restrictions relating to prohibited lobbyist
 contributions enacted in Act 128, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023
 (Act 128). Act 128 left concurrent administrative oversight to
 the campaign spending and state ethics commissions.

6 For the purpose of administrative efficiency and streamlining of function, this Act clarifies that with respect 7 8 to the statutory provisions created and amended by Act 128, the 9 campaign spending commission shall have oversight of elected 10 officials, candidates, candidate committees, and others required 11 to file an organizational report with the campaign spending 12 commission, and the ethics board or commission having 13 jurisdiction over the lobbyist shall have oversight of 14 lobbyists.

15 This Act further clarifies that the regular or special16 sessions in which lobbyist contributions are prohibited are

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periods during which both houses of the legislature are in
 session.

3 SECTION 2. Section 11-365, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "[+]\$11-365[+] Contributions and expenditures by lobbyists 6 prohibited during legislative session. (a) During any regular 7 session or special session of the [state] legislature, including 8 any extension of any regular session or special session and any 9 legislative recess days, holidays, and weekends, and for five 10 calendar days before and after a session, no lobbyist shall 11 make, or promise to make at a later time, any contributions or 12 expenditures to or on behalf of an elected official, candidate, 13 candidate committee, or any other individual required to file an 14 organizational report pursuant to section 11-321. No elected 15 official, candidate, candidate committee, or other individual 16 required to file an organizational report pursuant to section 17 11-321 shall accept, or agree to accept at a later time, any 18 contribution from a lobbyist during the specified period under this subsection. Any contribution prohibited by this subsection 19 20 shall escheat to the Hawaii election campaign fund. An elected

21 official, candidate, candidate committee, or any other

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1	individual required to file an organizational report pursuant to
2	section 11-321, alleged to have received a prohibited
3	contribution in violation of this section, shall be
4	administratively referred by the state ethics commission
5	executive director to the campaign spending commission.
6	(b) For the purposes of this section:
7	"Elected official" has the same meaning as in
8	section 11-342.
9	"Lobbyist" means any person actively registered as a
10	lobbyist with a state or county ethics board or commission.
11	"Session" means a period in which both legislative houses
12	are in session."
13	SECTION 3. Section 97-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 [.]	amended to read as follows:
15	"§97-5 Restricted activities. (a) No lobbyist shall
16	accept or agree to accept any payment in any way contingent upon
17	the defeat, enactment, or outcome of any proposed legislative or
18	administrative action. During any regular session or special
19	session of the [state] legislature, including any extension of
20	any regular session or special session and any legislative
21	recess days, holidays, and weekends, and for five calendar days

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1	before and after a session, no lobbyist shall make, or promise
2	to make at a later time, any contributions or expenditures to or
3	on behalf of an elected official, candidate, candidate
4	committee, or any other individual required to file an
5	organizational report pursuant to section 11-321.
6	(b) A state lobbyist alleged to have made a prohibited
7	contribution to an elected official, candidate, candidate
8	committee, or any other individual required to file an
9	organizational report pursuant to section 11-321 in violation of
10	this section shall be administratively referred by the executive
11	director of the campaign spending commission to the state ethics
12	commission.
13	(c) Any contribution prohibited by this section shall
14	escheat, as directed by the campaign spending commission, to the
15	Hawaii election campaign fund.
16	[(b)] <u>(d)</u> For the purposes of this section[, "elected]:
17	"Elected official" has the same meaning as in
18	section 11-342.

19 "Session" has the same meaning as in section 11-365."

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SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the
application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
of this Act are severable.

10 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
