A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST HAWAII ISLAND COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds and declares that the
 issuance of special purpose revenue bonds under this Act is in
 the public interest and for the public health, safety, and
 general welfare.

5 SECTION 2. Pursuant to part II, chapter 39A, Hawaii 6 Revised Statutes, the department of budget and finance, with the 7 approval of the governor, is authorized to issue special purpose 8 revenue bonds in a total amount not to exceed \$80,000,000, in 9 one or more series, for the purpose of assisting West Hawaii 10 Community Health Center, Inc., a Hawaii nonprofit corporation 11 doing business as Hawaii Island Community Health Center, in 12 financing the costs of purchasing or leasing land and designing, 13 constructing, improving, purchasing, and equipping primary care 14 health care facilities on the island of Hawaii, including costs 15 to:

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1 (1) Purchase or lease land, and design, construct, 2 furnish, and equip, including information technology equipment and solar panels, a forty-five thousand 3 4 square feet medical, dental, behavioral health, pharmacy, specialty care campus to serve the residents 5 6 of Kailua-Kona; Design, renovate, furnish, and equip, including 7 (2) information technology equipment and solar panels, a 8 ten thousand square feet facility owned by Hawaii 9 Island Community Health Center in downtown Hilo, 10 transforming the facility from administrative space to 11 12 a one-stop primary health care facility for women's health, pediatric care, and family medicine; 13 Purchase or lease land, and design, construct, 14 (3) furnish, and equip, including information technology 15 equipment and solar panels, a new ten thousand square 16 feet primary health care facility to serve the 17 residents of Pahoa and surrounding communities in the 18 Puna District; 19 Design, renovate, furnish, and equip a three thousand 20 (4)

six hundred square feet building owned by Hawaii

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Island Community Health Center to house health care
 workers working at the Hawaii Island Community Health
 Center medical and dental clinic located in Naalehu,
 located in the Kau District; and

5 (5) Other related expansion projects.

6 The legislature hereby finds and determines that the 7 purchase or lease of land and the design, construction, 8 improvement, purchase, and equipping of primary care health care 9 facilities on the island of Hawaii by Hawaii Island Community Health Center constitute a project as defined in part II, 10 11 chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the financing thereof 12 is assistance to not-for-profit corporations that provide health 13 care facilities to the general public.

SECTION 3. The special purpose revenue bonds and the refunding special purpose revenue bonds issued under this Act shall be issued pursuant to part II, chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the power to issue special purpose revenue bonds to assist not-for-profit corporations that provide health care facilities to the general public.

20 SECTION 4. The department of budget and finance is
21 authorized, from time to time, including times subsequent to

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June 30, 2030, to issue special purpose revenue bonds in 1 2 whatever principal amounts the department shall determine to be 3 necessary to refund the special purpose revenue bonds authorized 4 in section 2 and to refund special purpose revenue bonds 5 authorized in this section, regardless of whether the 6 outstanding special purpose revenue bonds or refunding special 7 purpose revenue bonds have matured or are the subject of 8 redemption or whether the refunding special purpose revenue 9 bonds shall be bonds for the multi-project programs described in 10 section 2. In making this determination, the department shall 11 comply with federal law relating to the exemption from federal 12 income taxation of the interest on bonds of the nature 13 authorized by this section.

SECTION 5. The authorization to issue special purpose
revenue bonds under this Act shall lapse on June 30, 2030.
SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
