## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "Mila Microchip Identification Act".

SECTION 2. The legislature finds that since January 1, 3 4 2022, all cat and dog owners in Hawaii have been required to have a microchip implanted in their pet and to register that 5 microchip number and the owner's contact information with a 6 microchip registration company. The legislature further finds 7 that when employees of the state and county agencies responsible 8 9 for disposing roadkill pick up dead cats and dogs that have been killed on public roadways, they do not routinely scan the 10 11 deceased animals for microchips or take any other measures to ascertain the animal's owner. As a result, owners of lost cats 12 13 or dogs are not informed if their pet has been killed by a 14 vehicle.

15 The legislature further finds that the tragic incident
16 involving a dog named Mila, as reported by KITV News on
17 November 8, 2024, highlights a critical gap in existing policies

1	and procedures. Due to the absence of proper scanning equipment		
2	within the department of transportation and the lack of clear		
3	rules for owner notification, Mila was disposed of without her		
4	owner being informed. This measure seeks to address such		
5	deficiencies by establishing clear directives for notification		
6	and the use of scanning equipment to prevent similar occurrences		
7	in the future.		
8	Furthermore, the legislature recognizes that this measure		
9	aligns with the intent expressed in the previous legislative		
10	session through House Concurrent Resolution No. 171 and House		
11	Resolution No. 150. By enacting this legislation, the		
12	legislature affirms its commitment to animal welfare and		
13	responsible procedures for handling lost or deceased pets.		
14	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:		
15	(1) Require the department of transportation and each		
16	county to:		
17	(A) Scan any cat or dog carcass found on a state or		
18	county roadway for a microchip;		
19	(B) Record certain information and report that		
20	information to the appropriate county animal		
21	services or animal service contractors; and
