A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RELIEF FUNDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that ensuring student
 well-being by providing student aid in direct response to an
 emergency or disaster is a matter of statewide concern.

4 SECTION 2. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "§304A-2153 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special 7 fund. (a) There is established the [University] university of 8 Hawaii tuition and fees special fund into which shall be 9 deposited all revenue collected by the university for regular, summer, and continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related 10 course and fee charges, and any other charges to students, 11 12 except as provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall be expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and 13 14 operations and shall not be:

15 (1) Used as a justification for reducing any budget
16 request or allotment to the university unless the
17 university requests such a reduction;

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1 (2) Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the 2 legislature; and 3 (3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance 4 without the prior approval of the legislature. 5 Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in 6 contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public 7 policy. (b) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of 8 9 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually, 10 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of 11 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for 12 deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the 13 purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant 14 to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not 15 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university 16 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing 17 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this 18 subsection no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 19 each regular session.

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1	(1)	Identify each department of the University of Hawaii
2		Foundation supported by moneys from the fund;
3	(2)	Describe the purposes and activities of each
4		department identified in paragraph (1) and how it
5		participates in fundraising activities and benefits
6		the university;
7	(3)	Provide the total expenditures of each department
8		identified in paragraph (1) by primary expense
9		categories;
10	(4)	Identify all moneys from the fund transferred to any
11		fund of the university and provide a justification of
12		how these moneys are used to benefit the university;
13	(5)	Provide a financial summary of the operating
14		activities of the University of Hawaii Foundation,
15		including revenues and expenditures by major reporting
16		categories; and
17	(6)	Identify amounts and purposes of all expenditures from
18		the [University] university of Hawaii support fund.
19	(c)	Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the
20	university	y may transfer funds from the [University] <u>university</u>
21	of Hawaii	tuition and fees special fund into the scholarship and

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1 assistance special fund established pursuant to section 2 304A-2159. 3 (d) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of 4 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually, 5 excluding in-kind services, from the university of Hawaii 6 tuition and fees special fund for the purposes of providing 7 student aid in direct response to an emergency or a disaster, as 8 declared by the governor. The university shall submit a 9 comprehensive report to the legislature detailing the use of any 10 funds authorized by the board under this subsection no later 11 than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session. 12 [(d)] (e) In estimating its quarterly budget requirements, 13 each campus of the [University] university of Hawaii shall prepare a plan for the fiscal year for the operation of each of 14 15 the programs that it is responsible for administering. The 16 operations plan shall be: 17 In such form and content as the vice president for (1) budget and finance and chief financial officer of the 18 19 [University] university of Hawaii may prescribe; and

20 (2) Submitted, together with the estimated quarterly
21 budget requirements, to the vice president for budget

4	[.(e)	[(c)] <u>(f)</u> The president and vice president for budget and				
5	finance and chief financial officer of the [University]

9		(A)	It is consistent with the policy decisions of the			
10			board of regents and appropriations by the			
11			legislature;			
12		(B)	It reflects proper planning and efficient

14		(C)	Appropriations have been made for the planned			
15			purpose and will not be exhausted before the end			
16			of the fiscal year;			
17	(2)	Shal	l approve the operations plan for each campus if			
18		they	determine that the operations plan meets the			
19		requ	irements of paragraph (1); and			
20	(3)	May	modify or withhold the planned expenditures of any			
21		camp	us at any time during the appropriations period.			

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1	[(f)] <u>(g)</u> At the end of each fiscal year, the moneys in
2	the [University] <u>university</u> of Hawaii tuition and fees special
3	fund for each campus shall lapse to the credit of program
4	identification number UOH900 ([University] <u>university</u> of Hawaii,
5	system wide support)."
6	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
