BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 704-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (11) to read as follows:

7	duties as employees of the State or a county, shall be paid by

12	SECTION 2. Section 704-407.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending subsection (12) to read as follows:
14	"(12) The compensation of persons making or assisting in

10	2026-2027 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
11	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary
12	for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
