# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FALL PREVENTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that unintentional falls
- 2 among seniors age sixty-five years and older in Hawaii are the
- 3 leading cause of fatal injuries (an average of forty-nine per
- 4 cent) and injury-related emergency room visits (an average of
- 5 sixty-one per cent). On average, one hundred and fourteen
- 6 seniors die, ten thousand are treated in hospitals, and six
- 7 thousand one hundred are treated in emergency departments as a
- 8 result of falls.
- 9 The legislature further finds that falls among the elderly
- 10 also result in over \$100,000,000 in combined hospital charges
- 11 each year. In recognition of this critical public health issue,
- 12 Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014 (Act 153), established and
- 13 provided funding for a fall prevention and early detection
- 14 coordinator position within the department of health's emergency
- 15 medical services and injury prevention system branch. This
- 16 position enables the department of health to support a

- 1 coordinated statewide approach to prevent and reduce the impact
- 2 of falls among older adults.
- 3 The legislature also finds that access to fall prevention
- 4 services and programs would significantly reduce costs
- 5 associated with falls among older adults by expediting
- 6 treatment, minimize serious long-term consequences, reduce the
- 7 extent of the injury, and, in some instances, avoid death.
- **8** Falls among older adults are a significant public health
- 9 issue. Yet, there are insufficient resources to develop a
- 10 coordinated statewide approach to reduce and promptly detect
- 11 falls among seniors. A dedicated fall prevention program can
- 12 serve as a focal point for statewide injury prevention and
- 13 detection efforts to ensure multidisciplinary support,
- 14 coordination of prevention and detection efforts, and continuity
- 15 of implementation and accountability.
- 16 The legislature additionally finds that continued support
- 17 of fall prevention programs and services ultimately results in
- 18 longer, healthier lives for the State's aging population.
- 19 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 20 department of health for the current fall prevention campaign.

- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2026-2027 for the department of health's current fall prevention
- 6 campaign.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 8 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
