## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§321- Alcohol and drug abuse division; homeless triage
5	and treatment center program; establishment. (a) The
6	department shall establish a homeless triage and treatment
7	center program within the alcohol and drug abuse division that
8	focuses on serving homeless individuals and individuals at risk
9	of homelessness with substance abuse issues or mental illness.
10	(b) The homeless triage and treatment center program
11	shall:
12	(1) Provide access to emergency food, shelter, housing
13	navigation, and supportive services;
14	(2) Collaborate with existing homeless outreach and case
15	management services;
16	(3) Provide medical assessments;



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

16	SECT	ION 2. Section 334-171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
18	"(a)	There shall be established within the department a
19	crisis in	tervention and diversion services program to redirect
20	persons,	including homeless persons, experiencing mental health
21	disorders	and co-occurring mental health and substance use



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1	disorders who are at risk for involvement, or currently
2	involved, with the criminal justice system to the appropriate
3	health care system and services. The program may include
4	intensive mobile outreach services. The department shall
5	collaborate with law enforcement agencies, courts, mental health
6	providers, and the community for the execution and
7	implementation of these services. Any appropriation for the
8	crisis intervention and diversion services program shall be used
9	only for services contracted directly between the department and
10	the service provider."
11	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
15	2026-2027 to implement this Act.
16	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
17	of health for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
