# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public utilities
commission provides critical services that ensure access to a
basic set of essential telecommunications services for
individuals who are blind or visually impaired.

5 In 1995, the legislature established the universal service 6 program, the purpose of which, in relevant part, is to help customers with disabilities access and maintain a basic set of 7 8 essential telecommunications services as determined by the 9 commission. By law, all telecommunications carriers are 10 required to contribute to this program. However, the universal 11 service program is currently inactive with no funds available in 12 the universal service fund. Moreover, the public utilities 13 commission lacks clear legislative authority to develop a 14 program addressing print disability through the universal service fund and does not have budget authorization to expend 15 16 funds for this purpose.

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1	Acco	ordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide clearer
2	authoriza	tion and guidance for the public utilities commission
3	to implem	nent and manage the universal service program
4	effective	ely, using funds from the universal service fund.
5	SECI	ION 2. Section 269-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended t	to read as follows:
7	"[+]	<pre>§269-41[] Universal service program; establishment;</pre>
8	<pre>purpose;</pre>	principles. There is established the universal service
9	program.	The purpose of this program is to:
10	(1)	Maintain affordable, just, and reasonable rates for
11		basic residential telecommunications service, as
12		defined by the commission;
13	(2)	Assist customers located in the areas of the State
14		that have high costs of essential telecommunications
15		service, low-income customers, and customers with
16		disabilities, in obtaining and maintaining access to a
17		basic set of essential telecommunications services as
18		determined by the commission. The commission may
19		expand or otherwise modify relevant programs, such as
20		the lifeline program under section 269-16.5;

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1	(3)	Ensure that consumers in all communities are provided
2		with access, at reasonably comparable rates, to all
3		telecommunications services [ <del>which</del> ] <u>that</u> are used by a
4		majority of consumers located in metropolitan areas of
5		the State. The commission shall provide for a
6		reasonable transition period to support the statewide
7		deployment of these advanced telecommunications
8		services, including[ $_{ au}$ ] but not limited to[ $_{ au}$ ] the use
9		of strategic community access points in public
10		facilities, such as education, library, and health
11		care facilities;
12	(4)	Ensure that consumers are given the information
13		necessary to make informed choices among the
14		alternative telecommunications carriers and services;
15		[and]
16	(5)	Promote affordable access throughout the State to
17		enhanced government information and services,
18		including education, health care, public safety, and
19		other government services $[-,]$ and
20	(6)	Ensure access to essential telecommunications services
21		for individuals with print disabilities, including

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1	providing free, print-disability-friendly telephonic
2	access to time-sensitive information for individuals
3	who are blind or visually impaired. For the purposes
4	of this paragraph, "time-sensitive information"
5	includes state and government information, public
6	notices, emergency alerts, job opportunities, and
7	daily newspapers.
8	The commission shall administer the universal service
9	program, including the establishment of criteria by which the
10	purposes of the program are met."
11	SECTION 3. Section 269-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended as follows:
13	1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:
14	"(a) There is established outside of the state treasury a
15	special fund to be known as the universal service fund to be
16	administered by the commission to implement the policies and
17	goals of universal service $[-, ]$ through the universal service
18	program. The fund shall consist of contributions from the
19	sources identified in subsections (e) and (f). Interest earned
20	from the balance of the fund shall become a part of the fund.
21	The commission shall adopt rules regarding the distribution of

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moneys from the fund including reimbursements to carriers for
providing reduced rates to low-income, elderly, residents of
underserved or rural areas, or other subscribers, as authorized
by the commission.

5 (b) <u>The commission may use available funds in the fund to</u> 6 provide free telephonic access to time-sensitive information for 7 individuals with print disabilities; provided that the amount of 8 funds expended from the fund for this purpose shall not exceed 9 <u>\$150,000</u>. The commission may allow distribution of funds <u>from</u> 10 <u>the fund</u> directly to customers based upon a need criteria 11 established by the commission."

12 2. By amending subsection (f) to read:

13 "(f) The commission shall designate the method by which the contributions under subsection (e) shall be calculated and 14 collected. The commission shall consider basing contributions 15 16 solely on the gross operating revenues from the retail provision 17 of intrastate telecommunications services offered by the 18 telecommunications carriers subject to the contribution. The 19 commission may determine the percentage of telecommunications 20 fees to be contributed to the universal service fund."







SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

**3** SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
