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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AN INTENSIVE MOBILE TEAM PILOT PROGRAM FOR HOUSELESS INDIVIDUALS SUFFERING FROM SERIOUS BRAIN DISORDERS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) There is established an intensive mobile
 team pilot program within the adult mental health division of
 the department of health to provide intensive mobile team
 services, also known as street psychiatry, to chronically
 houseless individuals suffering from serious brain disorders,
 including but not limited to schizophrenia and schizoaffective
 disorder.

8 (b) The pilot program shall establish one intensive mobile9 team in the community mental health center system.

10 (c) The intensive mobile team established for the purposes11 of the pilot program shall:

12 (1) Establish criteria for pilot program participation,
13 which shall include being houseless and suffering from
14 a serious brain disorder, prioritizing individuals
15 with schizophrenia or schizoaffective disorder;

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1	(2)	Manage at least forty participants, who shall be
2		vetted and enrolled by the intensive mobile team;
3	(3)	Offer after-hours availability to:
4		(A) Respond to crisis;
5		(B) Visit emergency rooms; and
6		(C) If and when participants are arrested, meet with
7		law enforcement and participants at the receiving
8		desk or similar place where the participant is
9		being held in custody to share information on
10		their participation in the pilot program;
11	(4)	Determine, in collaboration with area hospitals and
12		the behavioral health crisis center, appropriate
13		hospitalizations and behavioral health crisis center
14		admissions;
15	(5)	Prioritize housing placements for participants;
16	(6)	Begin participant treatment on psychiatric medications
17		when appropriate;
18	(7)	Actively pursue assisted community treatment orders
19		when appropriate;
20	(8)	Continue services if a participant is admitted to the
21		Hawaii state hospital;

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1	(9)	Enga	ge social work interns and advanced practice
2		regi	stered nurse students to expand service capacity
3		for	the target population;
4	(10)	Bill	third-party payors, medicare, or medicaid, as
5		appr	opriate for services; and
6	(11)	Be s	taffed as follows:
7		(A)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) human services
8			professional V, who shall serve as the clinical
9			supervisor;
10		(B)	A 0.5 full-time equivalent (0.5 FTE)
11			psychiatrist;
12		(C)	Five full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) human
13	·		services professionals or social workers;
14		(D)	A 0.5 full-time equivalent (0.5 FTE) registered
15			nurse;
16		(E)	A 0.1 full-time equivalent (0.1 FTE)
17			epidemiologist, epidemiology specialist, or
18			research statistician; and
19		(F)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program
20			specialist.

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1	(d)	The department of health shall collaborate with law			
2	enforceme	nt agencies, courts, hospitals, providers who serve			
3	houseless	individuals, mental health providers, and community			
4	stakehold	ers for the implementation of the pilot program.			
5	(e)	The adult mental health division of the department of			
6	health shall submit a report on the intensive mobile team pilot				
7	program to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to				
8	the convening of the regular sessions of 2026 and 2027. Each				
9	report shall include any proposed legislation and progress				
10	updates on the aggregate number of:				
11	(1)	Participant arrests;			
12	(2)	Participants requiring an emergency examination and			
13		hospitalization;			
14	(3)	Participants placed into housing;			
15	(4)	Participants started on medications;			
16	(5)	Participants hospitalized at the Hawaii state			
17		hospital;			
18	(6)	Participants reconnected with family; and			
19	(7)	Assisted community treatment orders pursued and			
20		granted.			

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(f) The intensive mobile team pilot program shall be
 dissolved on June 30, 2028.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 3 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 5 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 6 7 year 2026-2027 for eight and one-tenth full-time equivalent (8.1 8 FTE) positions, who shall be exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii 9 Revised Statutes, operating costs, and equipment pursuant to 10 this Act.

11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department12 of health for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
